ART 131 Ceramics I

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Introduction to the fundamental techniques of creating ceramics. Course covers hand-constructed clay objects, glaze preparation, glaze application, the kiln and firing. Supplies cost extra. (Meets six hours per week).

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course students will:

- Increase their understanding of hand-constructed ceramic forms through demonstration and student participation in the following areas:
 - 1.1 Coiling
 - 1.2 Pinching
 - 1.3 Slabing
 - 1.4 Wedging
- 2. Increase their understanding of ceramic glaze through lecture, demonstration and student participation in the following areas:
 - 2.1 Glaze participation
 - 2.2 Glaze application
- 3. Increase knowledge of ceramic clay through lecture
- 4. Increase knowledge of the ceramic kiln through lecture
- 5. Increase an aesthetic understanding of ceramic forms by methods which could include one or more of the following:
 - 5.1 Slide lecture
 - 5.2 Films
 - 5.3 Field trip
 - 5.4 Critique
