ASL 130 Intermediate Finger Spelling and Number Use

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will provide students with advanced instruction and practice in both expressive and receptive fingerspelling skills and builds on principles and techniques established in Visual Gestural Communication.

PREREQUISITE: ASL 115

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will:

- Develop expressive and receptive fingerspelling skills
- Develop principles and techniques established in Visual Gestural Communication
- Incorporate ASL numbering and fingerspelling appropriately into signed and voiced interpretations
- Incorporate ASL numbering and fingerspelling appropriately into conversational ASL
- Identify and use the morphologic elements of fingerspelling to increase accuracy
- Produce fingerspelling and numbering at a rate appropriate to specific interpreting situations while providing maximum clarity
- Identify the usages of ASL numbering and fingerspelling

ASSESSMENT METHODS:
