COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course examines the foundations of the Criminal Justice System and provides an historical perspective on the law's development. It also examines the main components of the Criminal Justice System including law enforcement (police), the court system, and corrections.

- 6. Summarize the origins of American criminal law.
- 7. Describe the structure of American law enforcement.
- 8. List 4 major functions of police departments.
- 9. List and define the stages
- 10. Describe the recent trends in the use of incarceration in the United States.
- 11. Summarize recent trends in juvenile incarceration.
