COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Provides detailed coverage of areas of introductory algebra needed by the technician to solve Electrical/Electronics circuits. The course includes fundamentals of algebra, ratio, proportion, variation, basic geometry and trigonometry, linear systems, determinants and matrices, factoring and quadratic equations, exponents and radicals, exponential, and logarithmic function. Emphasis is placed on practical application to the solution of DC circuits.
