COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed for EMT Paramedic students to practice the psychomotor skills in a hospital and EMS setting needed for entry level work. These include but are not limited to Medication administration, IV therapy, Cardiac Monitoring, and Airway Management.

PREREQUISITES: Program Admission

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will:

- At the completion of this clinical phase, the paramedic student will be able to integrate the
 principles of therapeutic communication to effectively communicate with any patient while
 providing care.
- At the end of this clinical phase, the paramedic student will be able to apply a process of clinical decision making to use the assessment findings to help form a field impression.
- At the completion of this clinical phase, the paramedic student will be able to follow an
 accepted format for dissemination of patient information in verbal form, either in person or over
 the radio.
- At the completion of this clinical phase, the paramedic student will be able to effectively
 document the essential elements of patient assessment, care and transport

ASSESSMENT METHODS:
