### ENG 292 Latino Literature II

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**CREDIT HOURS:** 3.00

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course includes a comprehensive survey of nationally renowned and emerging Latino writers, musicians, and screen writers, covering cultural, racial, and gender identity, political activism, sexual orientation and spirituality.

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG 120

**EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:**

Upon completion of this course, the student will be familiar with:

- Students will study Latino literature and culture by reviewing some of the canonical texts produced by Mexican American, Chicano and Hispanic Caribbean Diasporic writers.
- Students learn basic chronology of the immigration and incorporation of Latino populations into the United States.
- Students will learn to distinguish between sociological and historical studies of Latino populations and the analysis of the cultural manifestation about or produced by Latinos in the U.S.

**ASSESSMENT METHODS:**

Student performance may be assessed by examination, quizzes, case studies, oral conversation, group discussion, oral presentations. The instructor reserves the option to employ one or more of these assessment methods during the course.
