COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A chronological survey, the course focuses on the subjects, stories and symbols of visual art. Diverse cultures and styles are studied with examples that include Biblical scenes, African legends and contemporary American trends.

- Discuss the importance of the diverse forms of art.
 - Discuss these arts as creative forms of aesthetic experiences and social significance.
 - Analyze these arts as sensual, emotional, and intellectual forms of human endeavor.

 - Demonstrate an ability to critically think and write about the arts.
 - Demonstrate an enhanced appreciation of the art form.
