COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides observations and participation in structured learning roles and activities in a community agency, supervised by an agency fieldwork instructor with regular consultation and review with a college instructor.

PREREQUISITES:

MEH 110 and SAC 203 and HUS 135 and HUS 105 and HUS 110

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be familiar with:

- 1. To function as a responsible representative of the agency.
- 2. To take responsibility for specific productive helping professional tasks.
- 3. To relate to clients in ways consistent with the agency's purpose and function.
- 4. To accurately assess problem situations.
- 5. To utilize supervision and consultation constructively.
- 6. To make effective decisions and to improve upon past miscalculations in decision making.
- 7. To begin, sustain, and end an interview with purpose.
- 8. To differentiate among facts, speculations, generalizations, and conclusions.
- 9. To write complete, concise summaries of activities.
