MEH 226 Field Work II: Agency Placement

CREDIT HOURS: 4.00

CONTACT HOURS: 180.00

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a continuation of MEH 144 with emphasis on skills development and preparation for gainful employment.

PREREQUISITES:

MEH 144

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be familiar with:

- 1. Designate a staff member to supervise the students. The staff member will define the field experience for the students and make arrangements for other personnel to provide adjunct learning opportunities.
- 2. Allow students to participate in record keeping. Students will write reports documenting contacts with consumers of the service. The records may be examined by the field liaison for clarity and content. Students either may make notations in existing fields or use special dummy folders. If neither of the above options is possible, alternative arrangements can be made for gathering information and keeping records.
- 3. Provide the opportunity for students to experience direct contact with consumers of the service. Students' level of performance, as determined by individual abilities, provides the basis to determine the extent of student involvement. It is desirable for students to be offered the opportunity to provide direct services utilizing both individual and group methodologies.
- 4. Provide opportunities for students to learn the scope and function of the field work setting and the range of services it provides.

ASSESSMENT METHODS:

Student performance may be assessed by examination, quizzes, case studies, oral conversation, group discussion, oral presentations. The instructor reserves the option to employ one or more of these assessment methods during the course.
