COURSE SYLLABUS

PCT 200 Introduction to Patient Care

CREDIT HOURS: 5.00

CONTACT HOURS: 75.00

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides the student with the principles and techniques to provide patient care within the hospital, urgent care, and/or home health care environment. Students will learn to work under the supervision of nursing or medical staff in the role of the Patient Care Technician. This involves multi-skilled direct and in-direct patient care responsibilities including but not limited to diagnostic procedures such as 12-lead electrocardiography, phlebotomy and specimen collections. Emphasis will be placed on safety, documentation, standard precautions, legal and ethical considerations and OSHA standards.

PREREQUISITE: ALH 110, ALH 115, PLB 100, EMT 105

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Prepared for employment in the Patient Care Technology industry through applied knowledge of patient caregiving.
- Understand the basic principles of safety as it relates to Patient Care in acute care facilities or other health care settings.
- Prepared for the 5 national certification exams which include:
 - The National Certified Patient Care Technician (NCPCT) Exam
 - The National Registered Title of Certified Electrocardiography Technician (NRCEKG) Exam
 - The National Certified Phlebotomy Technician (NCPT) Exam
 - Phlebotomy Technician Certification (CPT)
 - The National Registry of Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) Certification
