COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This Course is designed for Phlebotomy students to learn the psychomotor skills for entry level work.

PREREQUISITES:

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be familiar with:

- 1. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner and demonstrate a commitment to Phlebotomy. Students are reminded that this is a health care profession with emphasis on dedicated service to people under adverse crisis situations.
- 2. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner and demonstrate a commitment to helping others in need.
- 3. Students are expected to attend all class sessions and should arrive prior to the start time.
- 4. Students are expected to practice skills to the proficiency level stated by the instructor in small groups with little supervision.
- 5. Students are expected to contact another student for any assignments, quiz or exam information for the next class.
- 6. Students are expected to communicate any concerns about the course material not understood, evaluation methods or students expectations to the instructor immediately.
- 7. That all assigned material is read prior to the class session.
- 8. That all workbook assignments are completed prior to the class session.
- 9. Students are to learn and understand all objectives stated by the instructor and at the beginning of each chapter, which was assigned.
- 10. Students are responsible to know the key terms from each chapter assigned by the instructor.
- 11. Students are expected to provide appropriate study time, at least 1 hour for each hour of class per week.
- 12. Students must be willing to provide extra study time, use computer lab, LRC, Access, or Multilearning Lab to assist them to successfully complete the course.
