COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a survey of state and local government, including structure, institutions and processes. The course stresses intergovernmental relations.

Prerequisite: PS 101

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Examines political institutions, actors, and issues within American state and local governments.
- Among other topics, our class will discuss federalism, political culture, state campaigns and elections, political parties, public policies, constitutional provisions, and state government branches (legislative, executive, and judicial).
