COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this course there will be the study and application of basic principles underlying effective oral communication with emphasis on public speaking.

PREREQUISITES: NONE

EXPECTED COMPETENCIES:

Upon successful completion of the course, students will:

- 1. Select and narrow a topic appropriate to the speaking purpose, the audience, and the situation.
- 2. Formulate a thesis statement consistent with the speaking purpose.
- 3. Use a suitable organizational pattern and incorporate effective transitions.
- 4. Provide supporting material that demonstrates research.
- 5. Enact informative and persuasive strategies.
- 6. Use effective oral delivery.
- 7. Use effective physical delivery.
- 8. Select appropriate language to communicate ideas vividly, accurately, and respectfully.
- 9. Design and use effective presentational aids.
- 10. Engage in ethical communication by demonstrating respect for the audience, the topic, the content, and the consequences of the speech.

ASSESSMENT METHODS:
