Dental Hygiene

The Dental Hygiene Program graduates and prepares students each year to take board examinations. Those examinations include the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination (NBDHE) and the Commission on Dental Competency Assessment-Western Regional Examining Board-Council of Interstate Testing (CDCA-WREB-CITA). Successful completion of these examinations afford students the ability to obtain licensure from the State of Michigan, Licensing and Regulatory Affairs-Bureau of Professional Licensing, along with 49 other jurisdictions.

Dental Hygiene

Upon completion of the Dental Hygiene program, graduates are eligible to take the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination (NBDHE) and the Commission on Dental Competency Assessment-Western Regional Examining Board-Council of Interstate Testing (CDCA-WREB-CITA). After, successful completion of these examinations graduates are eligible to apply for licensure through the State of Michigan or 49 other jurisdictions. Once licensure is received, WCCCD dental hygiene graduates may obtain employment as a licensed Registered Dental Hygienist.
