
THE DIVISON OF STUDENT SERVICES



DISTRICT PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT



Winter time is holiday time - and that means lots of cooking, lots of entertaining, and unfortunately, lots of opportunities for home fires to occur. During the holiday season, electrical fires are one of the leading causes of home and Christmas tree fires. Use electricity safety to avoid the following common causes of electrical fires:

- Overloaded outlets
- Misuse of extension cords
- Not turning off lights and decorations before going to bed or leaving the home
- Old or worn holiday lights
- Old or worn out appliances and electrical cords

One of the best ways to protect yourself and your family from a house fire is by having working smoke detectors in your home. By providing early warning of fire, smoke detectors can double your chances of escaping a fire safely. Follow these tips to keep you, your family and your belongings safe from fire:

- Check your smoke detectors monthly. Only a working smoke detector can save your life.
- Replace the batteries in your smoke detectors twice a year. When you change your clocks for Daylight Savings, change your batteries.
- Install smoke detectors on each level of your home and sleeping areas. Sleep with your bedroom door closed.
- Make sure overnight guests also know your fire escape plan.
- Install a carbon monoxide detector if you have any appliance or device that has a flame stove, water heater, furnace, fireplace, space heater, etc.
- Do not use your stove or oven to heat your house.
