ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

The Fiscal Accountability Operation Center (FAOC) would like to thank everyone who assisted with the year-end close. For the 2012/13 fiscal year the requisition users processed a total of 3,726 requisition requests. That was an 11% increase from the previous fiscal year. Proper paper work being entered into the Banner System by departments helped decrease the number of incomplete requisitions going into the system.

DEFFERED MAINTENANCE

Since the opening of the Larry K. Lewis Education Center, additional improvements have been taking place around the Northwest Campus grounds. Installation of the new pedestrian sidewalk leading from the east gate on Outer Drive to the Laboratory Science and General Arts Building was completed. This new addition is part of our commitment to ensure safety and functionality to students, staff, faculty and the community.



INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

OFFICE OF ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY

The Office of Accountability and Transparency collects, reviews and conducts monthly reconciliations and on-going audits of all District data. The systematic approach is used with data from multiple sources, allowing for collective knowledge through accountability and transparency. All data and audited reports are stored and available for use in the Continuous Quality Improvement Center located in the Chancellor's Office.



LEGISLATIVE CORNER

State and Legislative: Millage Elections Split— Two Michigan community colleges had millage questions before the voters this Tuesday. West Shore Community College was ultimately successful in convincing 70% of voters to approve renewal of .7602 operating mills for the next eight years. Unfortunately, voters turned down a .4 mill increase that Northwestern Michigan College requested.

New Report... Perspectives On No Worker Left Behind (NWLB): Results From a Participant Survey— According to the report, 162,000 people enrolled in NWLB. Key findings of the report indicate that program retention and completion rates were high (nearly 47% completed training, while more than 46% were still enrolled in their training program; more than 35% of respondents earned an industry recognized certificate, 16% earned an associate's degree, and 7% earned a bachelor's degree), and most respondents who completed training were employed (nearly two out of three found employment).

Tying Student Aid to Measures Like Graduation Rates— According to a new analysis by the Advisory Committee on Student Financial Assistance, awarding student financial aid to colleges based on outcome measures, like graduation rates, could harm low-income students and the colleges that serve them. The new report comes just weeks after the committee raised serious concerns about efforts to tie federal student aid to college-completion rates.

National News: New Community College Success Data from the National Student Clearing House Research Center

- ◆ Importance of Earning Community College Credential Before Transferring— Students who completed certificates or associates degrees before transferring, had a better chance of graduating with a bachelor's degree: 72% earned B.A.'s, compared with 56% of students who had moved on without a credential.
- ♦ Community College Graduation Rates Higher Than Previously Thought— Of the students who start at community colleges and then transfer to four-year institutions, more than 60% ultimately graduate.
