





Meet and Greet with Adjunct Faculty





Michigan Legislature

On Tuesday, the House Oversight Committee took testimony on two bills that aim to limit the cost of Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests. <u>House Bill 4001 (Shirkey)</u> would place limits on costs that responding agencies could charge, as well as penalizing agencies that fail to respond in a timely manner. <u>House Bill 4314 (McMillin)</u> would create an Open Government Commission to investigate complaints about how public bodies handle FOIA requests. The Committee may vote on the bills before the summer break.



Florida lawmakers and Gov. Rick Scott have ordered a complete overhaul of the state's college remedial programs. Under the legislation, <u>SB 1720</u>, colleges by 2014 will no longer be able to require recent high school graduates to take the state's standard placement test or to enroll in noncredit remedial courses. Active-duty members of the U.S. military will also be exempt. Students will be able to decide to skip remediation and enroll directly in credit-bearing courses; they will be deemed college-ready by holding a high school diploma.

Windows 7 Operating System Rollout

It's time to upgrade your computer from Windows XP if you have not done so. It will reach the end of life in 2014. The District IT division will be starting the rollout of Windows 7 operating system for the staff and faculty PCs. Organizations and individuals still using Windows XP will expose their selves to risks because security patches will no longer be available after April, 2014. According to Redmond Magazine (June 2013 issue); "Most experts and Microsoft itself advise moving to Windows 7 rather than Windows 8 and Office 2013".
