

#### **Tuition Reimbursement Program**


Tuition assistance is available to full-time and part-time regular staff. Employees are eligible for reimbursement between \$500 and \$2,000 depending on their union classification status. Employees must pass the


class with a "satisfactory" mark in order to be reimbursed. Tuition reimbursement forms should be turned in immediately after the semester ends with proof of grades and proof of payment.

All regular employees, their spouse and dependent children, who have not reached the age of 25 and who are living at home, are eligible for the tuition

waiver program. Proof of registration must be attached to the tuition waiver before submitting it to the Division of Human Resources (HR). Part-time faculty must be teaching during a particular semester in order to be eligible for a tuition waiver that semester. Proof of teaching must be presented to the HR at the time of tuition waiver submittal. **Spring 2015 tuition waivers are due in HR by Monday, January 12, 2015.** Waiver forms can be found at www.wcccd.edu under the Human Resources section.

## Office of Accountablilty and Transparency






#### **Spring 2015 Instructional Supply Requests**

# WEEKLY UPDATE

This week, the City of Detroit experienced a massive power outage. Part of the city including our District Administration building and the Downtown and Eastern campuses were affected by the power outage.

As a part of the Information Technology Transformation Plan (ITTP) the infrastructure upgrade and data center modernization included a backup generator. The generator was installed to support the data center for business continuity in an event of a power loss.

During the power outage the backup generator kicked in automatically powering the data center for a seamless operation. The banner system and other day-to-day operational servers were operational District-wide.





In addition to the data center, we prepared an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) equipped with computers and power feed from the generator. We were able to instantly activate the EOC to ensure critical business functions within the district can operate during a power outage. The payroll and accounts payable staff were able to utilize the work space to process critical and time sensitive information.

This incident demonstrates the District's readiness for unforeseen circumstances to continue serving our students, faculty, and staff 24/7 with no system interruptions.




Institutional Effectiveness WCCCD and National Research Trends

- institutional practices that affect students during this critical time



WCCCD Entering Student Surveys Findings

WCCCD surveys entering students much like the SENSE that asks, "From the time of your decision to attend this college through the end of the first three weeks of your first semester, please rate your level of agreement and/or level of importance in the following areas"

#### Top Areas of Importance for Attending WCCCD



- 67.1% reported WCCCD as their first and/or only college choice
- 59.3% prefer to take classes during weekdays with 19.5% preferring weekdays and weekends
- 61.2% reported registration process being convenient
- 57.9% travel 6 miles or less to WCCCD




# WCCCD and American Promise School Partnership

WCCCD and American Promise Schools are in the early phases of formalizing a partnership that will offer a college bridge program and career success path



program for their high school students. The launch date is schedule for Summer 2015. American Promise Schools' goal is to lead a campaign to meet a 75% college-going target for Detroit's children. Their goal is to create a replicable prototype for turning around failing urban high schools and implement that design at scale in the city. Currently, APS is managing the following three Detroit area schools: Jalen Rose Leadership Academy High School, Consortium College Preparatory High School and Voyageur Academy (K-8).




#### **Faculty Evaluations**

The Downriver Campus hosted Wayne RESA who conducted a workshop entitled Socratic Seminar with Matt Copeland. Matt Copeland is an author




and writing coach who discussed instructional strategies for engaging students in the kind of intellectual discourse needed to write compellingly.


