




WCCCD Police Officer's Graduation

These officers, after being sworn in, will have the powers and authority of a municipal police officer equivalent to a Michigan State trooper, Detroit police officer or a Wayne County Sheriff deputy. They have statewide jurisdiction and the authority to regulate and control traffic on the public way adjacent to all District owned or controlled property.




Fall Grade Submissions

- * Use apps side-by-side and much more










Student Incentives!


LANGUAGE INSTITUTE
