
Third Party Vendors


The Bursar's Office is processing third-party invoices for the Spring 2015 semester. Third-party organizations play a vital role by eliminating cost barriers and providing students with access to higher education.

According to a report from the Society of Human Resource Management, at least 54% of employers offer undergraduate tuition assistance with an average maximum tuition reimbursement of \$4,591. Taking advantage of this benefit can be an affordable way to pursue a degree. WCCCD currently has more than 30 third-party vendors that actively participate in a tuition assistance program.

Higher One Refund Management

The District partnered with Higher One to implement a refund management system for all WCCCD academic students. This refund management system has allowed our students greater options and advantages in receiving their refunds. Currently 48% of those cards have been activated and more than 10,000 disbursements have gone out. Of all students who were eligible for a refund this term, 91% had signed on to the Higher One website and made their preference prior to their funds being released.

Michigan Community College Business Officers Association Workshop

The Michigan Community College Business Officers Association held their spring 2015 workshop in Lansing, MI. Mike Hansen, President of Michigan Community College Association, presented legislative updates which included the status of a new Job Training bill and how minimum wages law affects hiring. Rehmann, an investment firm, presented a session on "Withholding and Reporting Payments to Non-U.S. Vendors." Discussion covered the types of tax forms required by the government for students and vendors.



Belleville Rotary Workshop


Ginger Bruder from the Belleville Museum provided an overview of Belleville, Michigan's history history during the time of the Civil War and the Union offices that were from the area.






HR Process Enhancement and Monthly Reconciliation



Data Analytics and Higher Education




Priority of Analytics

■Enrollment Report



Network Infrastructure Upgrade Next Phase

The WCCCD Wide- Area Network Project upgrades the network infrastructure in the data center and at each campus. The infrastructure upgrade enables high speed Wi-Fi Internet access throughout the entire district. It provides the advanced network platform that allows telephone calls to be carried on the data network, eliminating the need for a separate phone network.



Cisco 4500-X

The new Cisco Catalyst 4500-X Series campus core switches have been placed across the District. Each campus data closet will be upgraded with Cisco Catalyst 3850 access layer stacked switches.

The new server will provide Banner users with increased performance as well as smoother transactions and less slowdowns when reading and writing information out of the Banner system. This migration also includes all the new features of WCCCD's "Virtual Environment" which gives the IT new tools to provide for faster recoveries should a failure occur.

Articulation Agreements: Advancing our Partnerships

Goal 7 (Strengthen Partnerships with Four Year Colleges and Universities) of the 2015-2020 Strategic Plan has been positively impacted by the implementation of an articulation agreement plan of action. The plan successfully launched this year and in the first quarter of the year the following goals have been achieved:

- The District website has been updated to represent all current four year articulation partnerships.
- A comprehensive spreadsheet has been developed to track and monitor all agreements.
- Contact has been made with 100% of WCCCD partners to cultivate and expand the relationship.
- There has been a 15% increase in new and renewed articulation agreements.
- An electronic archiving and logging system has been developed to store agreements.
- The conversion of all hardcopy agreements is 80% complete.

REBUILDetroit Progress March - April 2015

We continue to make progress with the REBUILD grant. The consortium of WCCCD, University of Detroit Mercy, Marygrove College and Wayne State University has been awarded \$21.2 million over five years by the National Institute of Health (NIH) to implement a program encouraging more undergraduate students from underrepresented and economically disadvantaged backgrounds to pursue careers in biomedical research.
