
Inventory Control




WHAT'S TRENDING IN HIGHER EDUCATION PAYING FOR COLLEGE

Research and discussions on paying for college has been trending in higher education. At most institutions, financial aid helps put college within reach for many students. The Division of Institutional Effectiveness conducts regional and national scanning on trending topics to promote data driven decision making.

National data indicates that the percent of community college students utilizing financial aid is lower than their counterparts at four-year institutions as indicated by the graph below.

Nationally, community college students receive:

- an average of \$4,341 in federal grants
- an average of \$4,797 in federal loans






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


July Revenues Beat Expectations!


Study Abroad Trip to Dublin, Ireland Departs November 28, 2015!

- Intensive orientations process to prepare students for the academic challenge









WCCC opens child center

A new child care center for studentparents, faculty members and the community is now open at Wayne County Community College's (WCCC) Western Regional Center at 9555 Haggerty, Belleville.

Open for children from two months through 12 years, the indoor-outdoor center features a creative play area, an observation facility, a parent education program and an information resource library.

The center also serves as a learning ool for practicum students enrolled in VCCC's child care technology, psychology, nursing and dietetic technology tograms.

"We feel we are doing something rather unique at the western center," said Arlene. Altman, director of the child care program at WCCC. "Our concern for serving community members and our student-parents is to offer them an up-to-date place for their children to learn and develop."

The center is staffed with professionally trained child development specialists. At the center are hourly, half-day nursery school programs as well as emergency drop-in care and industrial and conference child care.
