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






Learning Resource Centers



Career Program Recruitment



Member Corner: Lessons in team leadership

Four lessons on effectively leading an inherited team.

Wayne County Community College Cistins (Thancellor Cutte). I hery suggested the districts essentive group read Michael Wathrist article. "Leading the Team You Inhers!"
