


ITI Outreach - Calls

Fall 2016 Tuition Waivers are due by August 23, 2016!

- All regular employees, their spouses and dependent children, who have not reached the age of 25 and who are living at home, are eligible for the Tuition Waiver Program.
- Proof of registration must be attached to the Tuition Waiver Form before submitting it to HR. Part-time faculty must be teaching during a particular semester in order to be eligible for a tuition waiver that semester.
- Proof of teaching must be presented to HR at the time the tuition waiver is submitted.

 - 4. Approved adjustments are submitted to accounting to assist for processing





Deferred Maintenance














Division of Institutional Effectiveness


Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) Rollout Update




Michigan Institute for Public Safety Education


