



Each head unit is capable of providing suction, oxygen and medical equipment power outlets in order to simulate scenarios in which patients are being treated.




New Standard Mileage Rate for 2016

SAFETY TIPS TO HELP PREVENT CARJACKING

Getting In Your Car

- Walk with purpose and stay alert.
- Approach your car with key in hand and look around and inside the car before getting in.
- Trust your instincts. if something makes you feel uneasy, get into the car quickly and drive away.

On the Road

- · Keep your doors locked and windows rolled up, no matter how short the distance.
- When you're coming to a stop, leave enough room to maneuver around other cars.
- Drive in the center lane to make it harder for would-be carjackers to approach the car.
- Avoid driving alone. Go with someone whenever possible, especially at night.

Getting Out


- Park in well-lit areas, near sidewalks or walkways. Avoid parking near dumpsters, woods, large vans or trucks, or anything else that limits your visibility.
- Never leave valuables in plain view, even if the car is locked, put them in the trunk or out of sight.

• Try to park in a garage with an attendant. Leave only the ignition key, without identification.

If It Happens to You...

- If the carjacker threatens you with a gun or other weapon, give up your car.
- Get away from the area as quickly as possible.
- Try to remember what the carjacker looked like sex, race, age, hair, eye color, special features, and clothes.
- Call 911 and report the crime immediately to the police.






Human Resources Compliance: Process Manual

The Importance of Employee Certifications





As part of Phase I of the VDI rollout project, the Division of Information Technology (IT) deployed an additional 25 zero client systems converting a classroom into a computer lab at the Downtown College.

Governor's Economic and Education Summit

This year's summit will be held in Grand Rapids on March 15, 2015. Broad focus is on collaboration between education and business.



New Community College Graduation Rates: Community college graduation rates over four years are significantly higher than on-time (two-year) graduation, according to new federal data. When looking at a two-year period, the graduation rate of full-time, first-time students attending public two-year colleges was 11.3% for the 2010 cohort year. When the periods was doubled to four years, the graduation rate jumped to 26.7%.

Education Trade Mission to Central America (May 2-5): The United States Department of Commerce, International Trade Administration, is organizing an education mission to Panama and Honduras, with an optionial stop in Guatemala. Each stop will include a student fair, customized appointments for each institution as well as site visits and networking opportunies.
