



















































































Charmed – A Young Lady's Guide to Every Day Etiquette






MIPSE hosted training on fire tactics for the Marathon Petroleum Emergency Response Team. This training course consisted of classroom instruction and hands-on activities.








Division of Institutional Effectiveness




Distance Learning



Staff and a student from Mott Community College recently conducted a best practice session at the District to review technological security operations.










District Alignment

Legislative Corner

Legislative Session Schedule

Both the House and Senate have adjourned officially until July 13, 2016 although it is likely that no further legislative action will take place until the August 2, 2016 primary election.

House Committee Approves Higher Education Changes

The House Committee on Education and the Workforce approved five higher education bills by unanimous consent. The bipartisan bills addressed areas ranging from consumer information and counseling for federal student aid borrowers, to FAFSA simplification and enhanced supports for Minority Serving Institutions.

Unemployment Rates Increased in Most Michigan Markets

Seasonally unadjusted unemployment rates went up in most of Michigan's 17 labor markets in May, figures released by the Department of Technology, Management and Budget showed. The jobless rate went up in 12 of the markets, the department said, largely because more people got into the job market looking for seasonal work.

Michigan 40th in Nation for Childhood Education


According to a report by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, 71% of Michigan fourth-graders aren't proficient in reading, and 71% of eighth-graders aren't proficient in math. More than half of the state's young children aren't in preschool.
