

Division of Institutional Effectiveness

What's Trending in Instituional Effectiveness? Distance Education

The Division of Institutional Effectiveness continuously reviews regional and national trends in higher education to support the District's enhancement of learning modalities such as distance education. According to the *Babson Study: Distance Education Enrollment Growth Continues,* more than 5.8 million students took at least one distance education course in 2014.

The total of 5.8 million fall 2014 distance education students is composed of 2.85 (49%) million taking all of their courses at a distance and 2.97 (51%) million taking some, but not all, distance courses. Approximately 21% of WCCCD students take at least one online education course each semester.


National Initiative - Giving Credit Where Credit is Due

to identify and translate these into college credit. WCCCD supports this trend by offering a credit for experience option to all students.












Campus Operation - 2016-17 Fall Supply Orders


