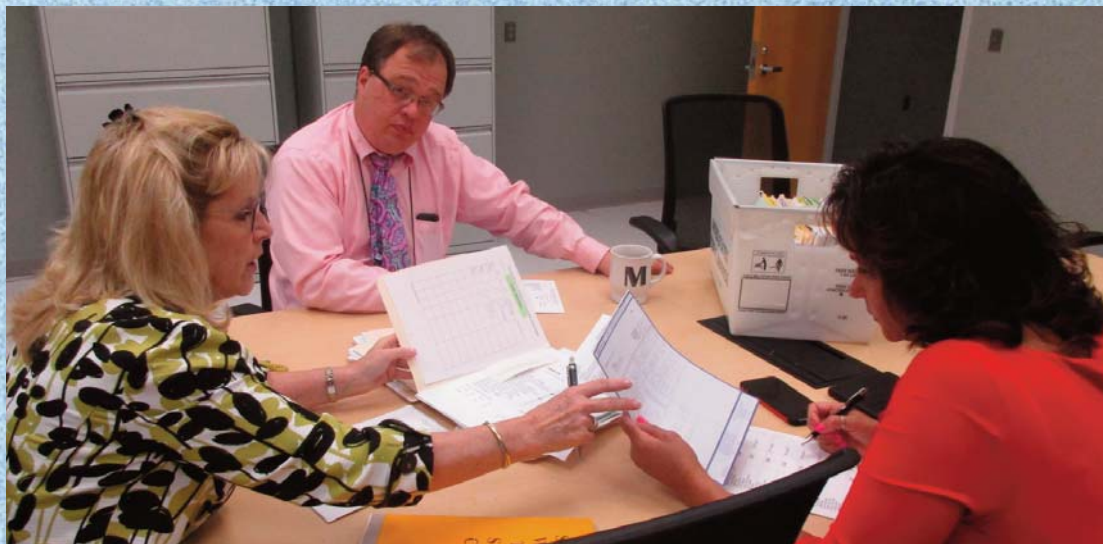


Health Science Center

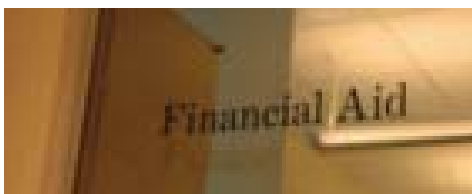




Student Athletes Earn Scholarships

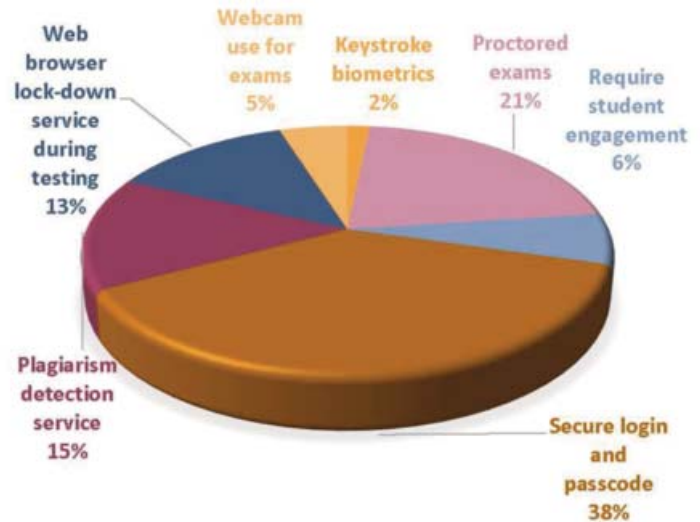

Fiscal Year-End Close Out

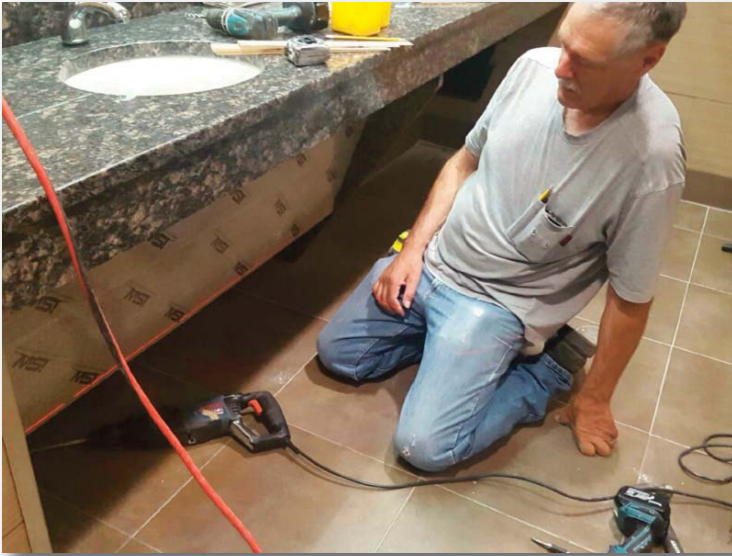
The General Accounting Department is preparing for its fiscal year-end close process. The department utilizes the following process for year end closing.

- Close the last period of the fiscal year.
- Perform file maintenance on the financial series group of modules.
- Verify the settings in the General Ledger Setup window.
- Make a backup
- Print a final Detailed Trial Balance report.
- Print the year-end financial statements.
- Set up a new fiscal year.
- Enter new year budget figures and print financial statements.
- Make a backup.

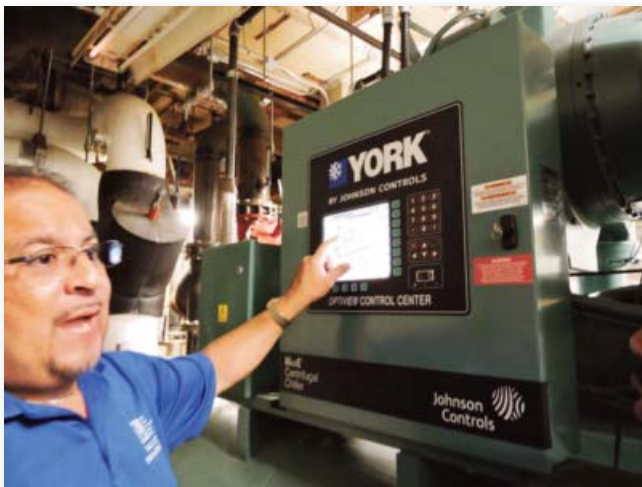

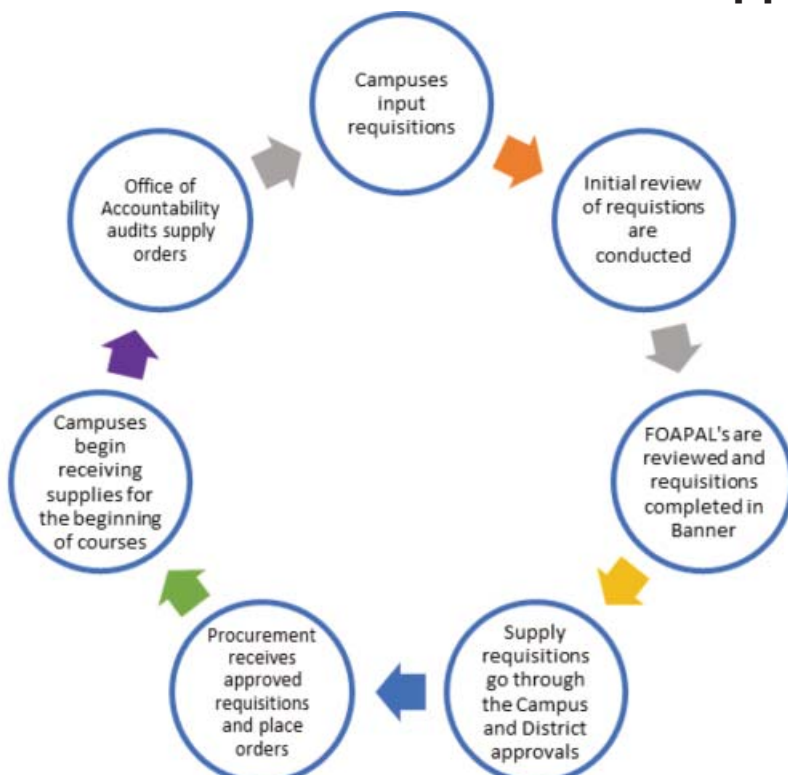


Continuous Quality Improvement Audit Center

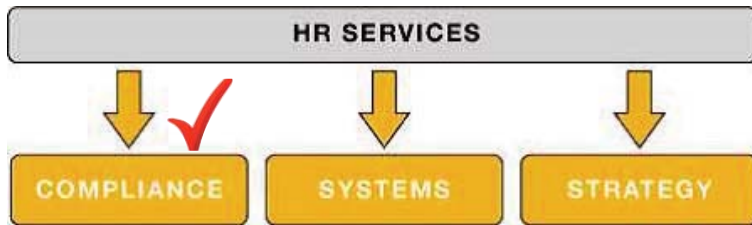
Instructional Supply Process

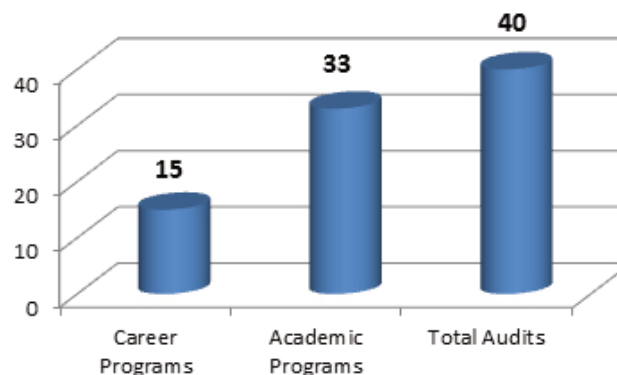
Faculty Assignment Audit

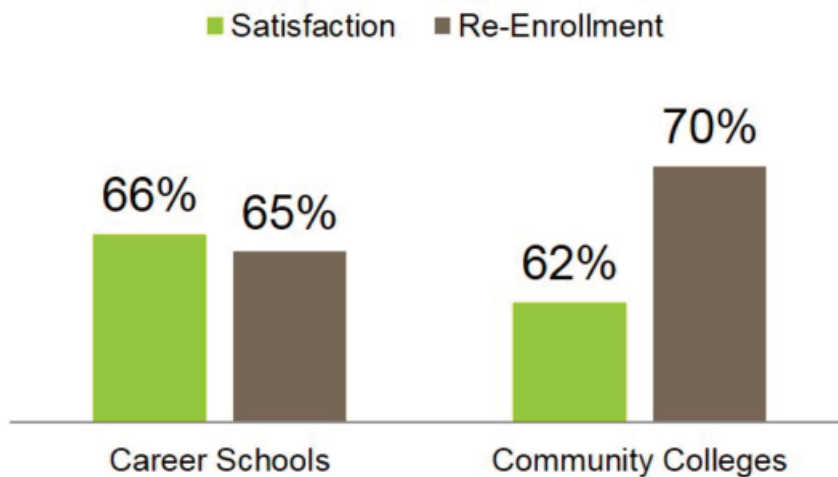

National Research: Student Satisfaction and Priorities

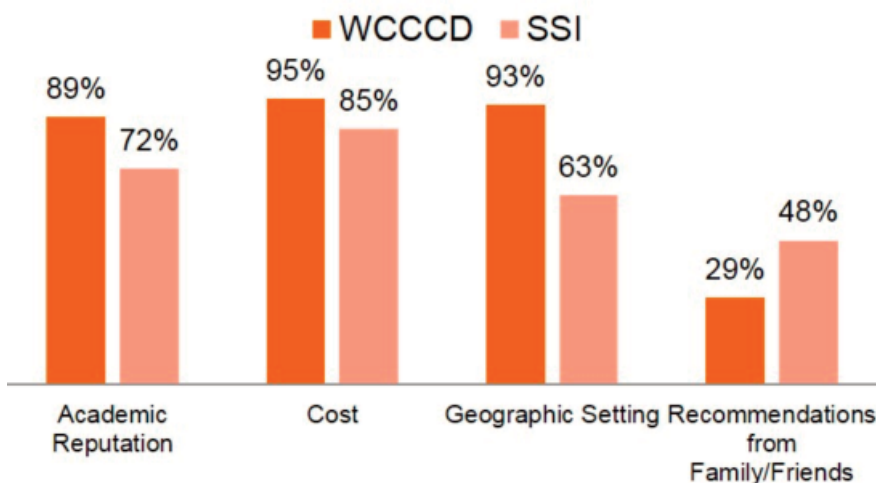

Community college students are more satisfied and more likely to re-enroll compared to other institution types.

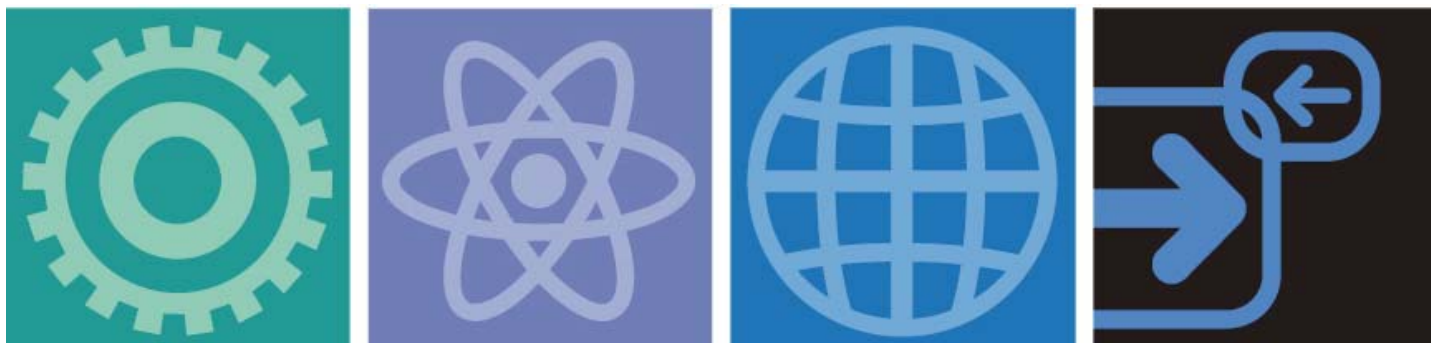
Factors that Contribute to Student Enrollment

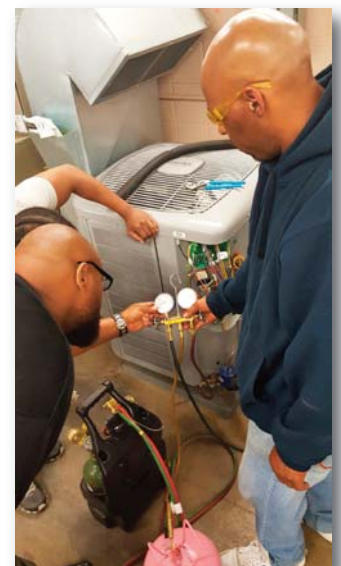

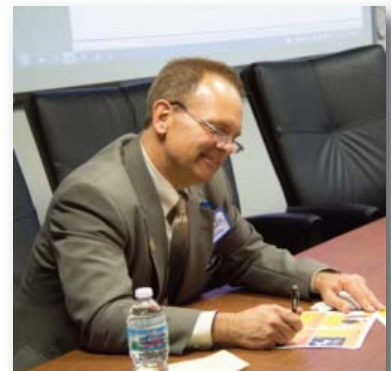
Intercultural Competency Workshop at the Eastern Campus

Legislative Corner

Legislature Finishes FY 2016-2017 Budgets

The Legislature finalized both the education and general fund omnibus budgets. In those budgets, the final operations increase for community college operations averages 1.4%, which is down from the 2.4% that the Governor originally recommended. Including the \$3.7 million increase for MPSEERS funding, the total increase for community colleges averages 2.1%. Unlike the budget for the universities, the community college budget does not include tuition restraint language.

Senate Labor-HHS-Education Funding Bill Calls for Year-Round Pell

The Senate Appropriations Committee marked up its FY 2017 Labor-HHS-Education spending bill, including the year-round Pell Grant provision. While details are not available yet, sources have indicated that part-time students may be eligible for the YRP. The YRP would be funded by using a portion of the current Pell Grant program surplus.
