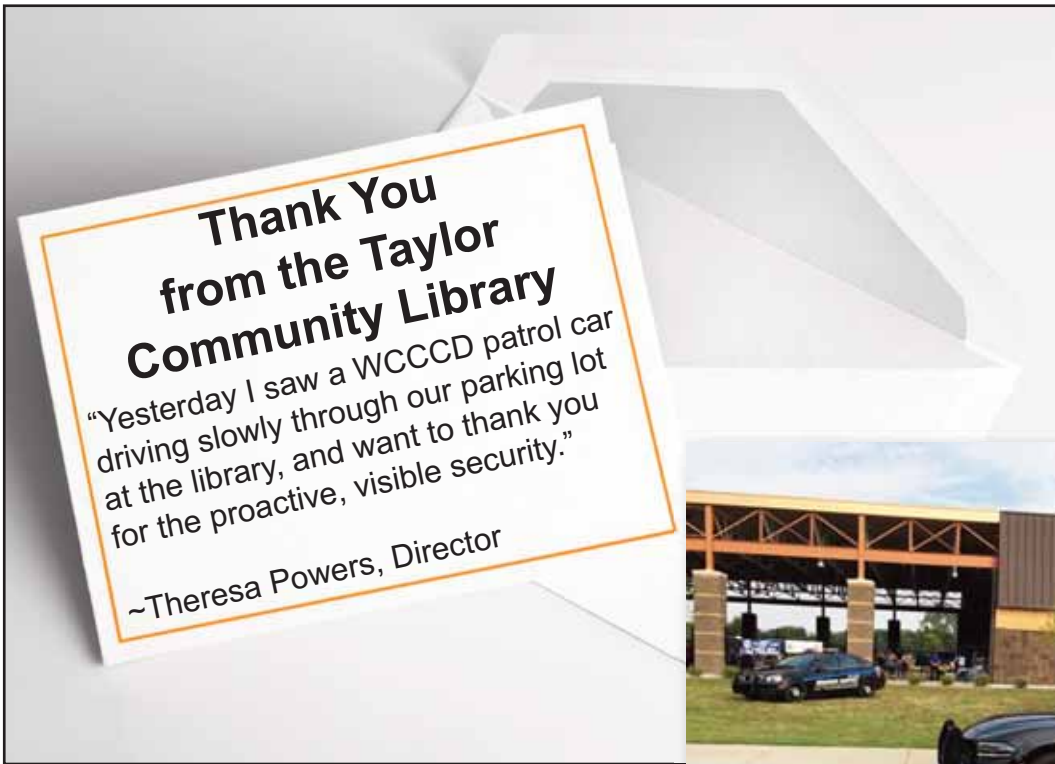

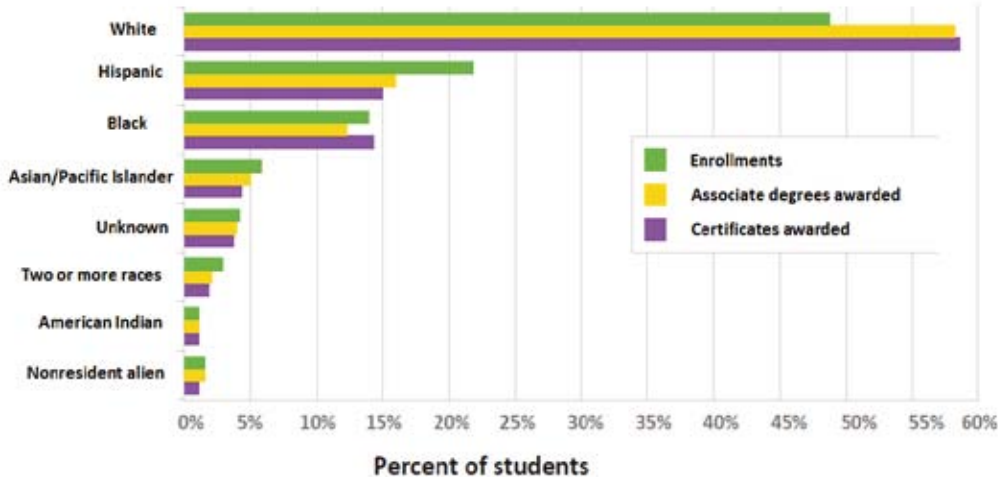


The District Call Center has relocated to the newly renovated office space in the District Office Building.

Distribution of enrollments and completions at community colleges: 2013-14



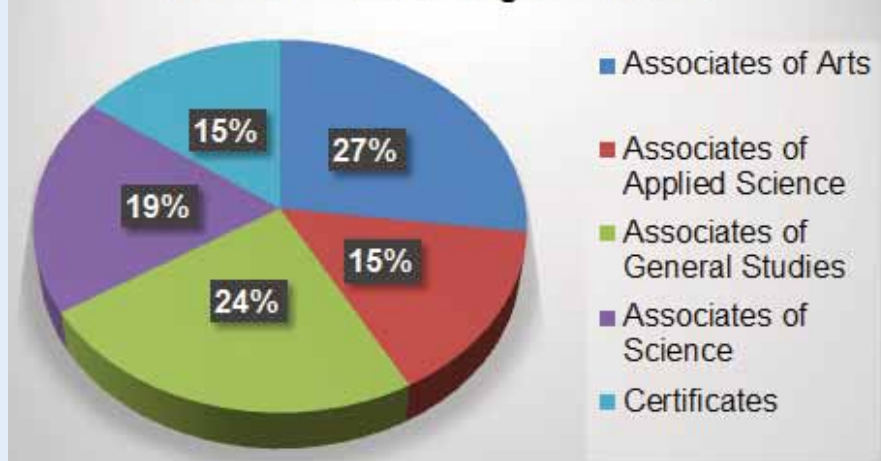

VoIP – Interactive Voice Response (IVR) Project

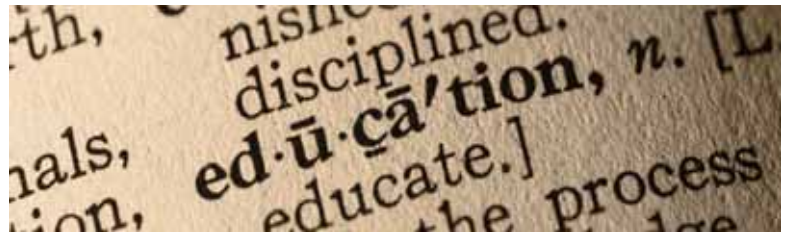

Division of Educational Affairs

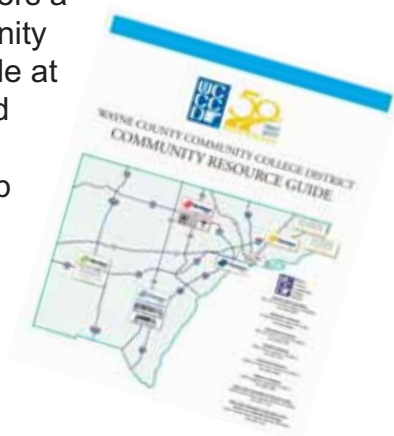

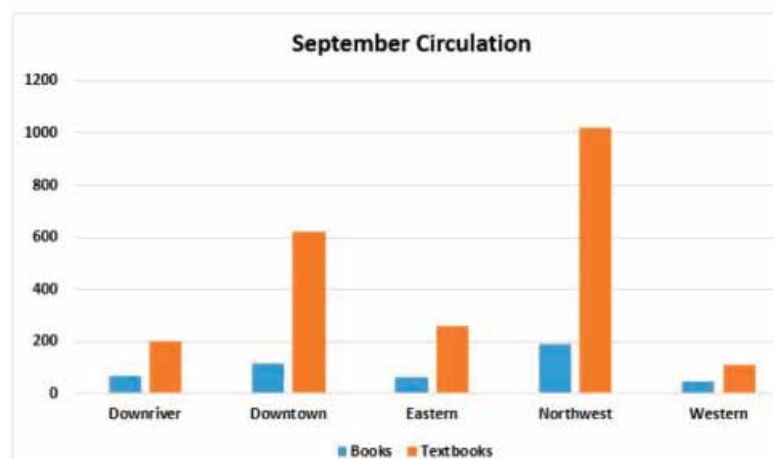

Homecoming Parade

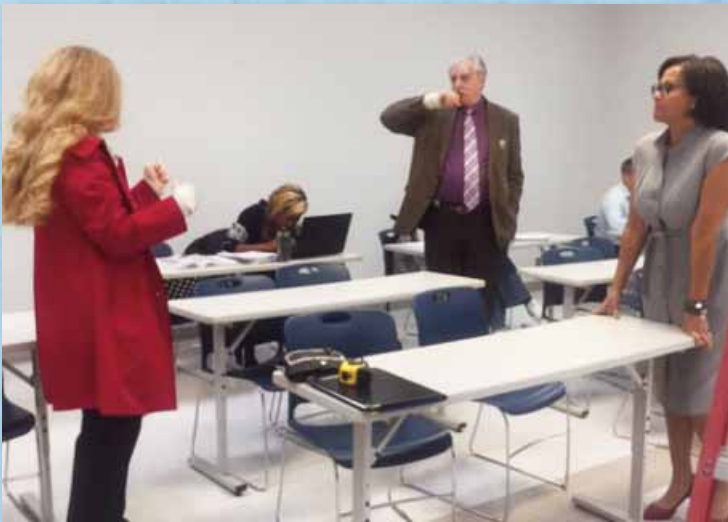
Anthony Arminiak, Mike Dotson and Dr. Sandra Robinson participated in the Homecoming Parade for Grosse Pointe South High School.

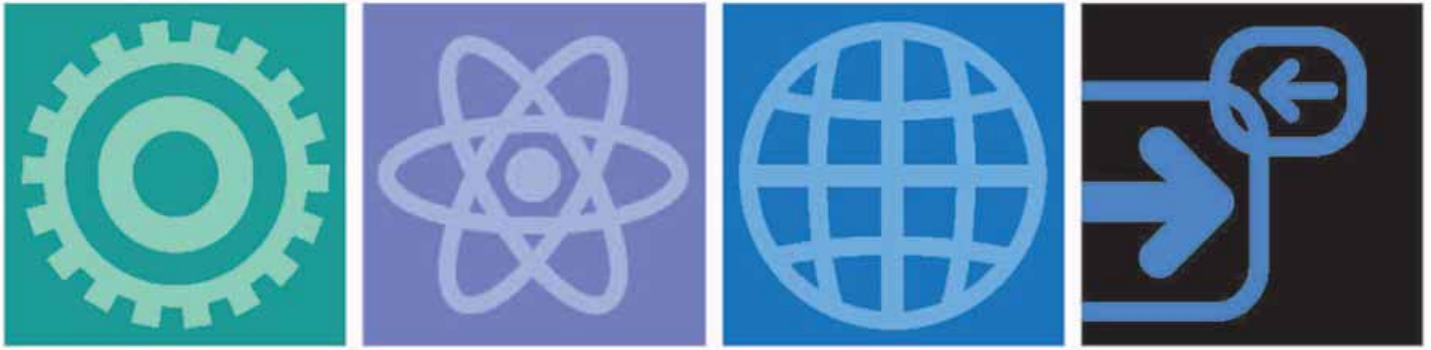

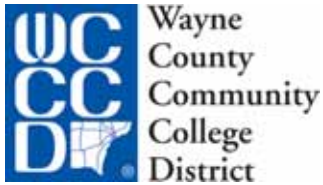
