Mr. Dotson chaired a ribbon cutting ceremony for the opening of T-Rex arms, a new business in Van Buren Township.





Distance Learning has been helping instructors with their Blackboard course set up by assigning Blackboard course shells for web-enhanced instructors (those who teach face-to-face classes and use Blackboard to supplement course content), linking to external publisher applications for textbook exercises and practice quizzes, and remedying any technical issues.

Transfer Education



Of the 720,000 degree-seeking students who entered a community college in Fall 2007, only about 100,000 of them — roughly 14% — transferred to a four-year college and earned a bachelor's degree within six years,...the odds are worse for low-income students, first-generation college students and students of color. Researchers, policymakers and lawmakers are taking a close look at transfer best-practices and policies for several reasons.







MIPSE also hosted the Wayne County Sheriff's Parks Mounted Motor Special Response Team for Motorcycle Update Re-Certification Training.






United States Postal Inspectors




