

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


Weekend College

Detroit Workforce System Leadership Development Academy Retreat



Shawna Forbes attended the Detroit Workforce System Leadership Development Academy Retreat. This 12-month program includes, collaborating on solutions and nationwide best practices to better engage employers, understand industry workforce needs, and develop successful career pathway strategies. The District was one of 22 applicants selected to be a part of J. P. Morgan Chase & Co. \$100 million investment in Detroit and commitment to its economic revival program.

The Academy will leverage and build on the expertise of leaders across the workforce ecosystem through an intensive twelve month learning program, led by local Detroit leaders and guest faculty from across the nation, providing the group with an opportunity to collaborate on developing practical solutions to solve some of the city's most challenging workforce issues.

Retail Management Certificate

The School of Continuing Education is excited to announce that WCCCD is among 12 Community Colleges across the country awarded a \$2.9 million grant, Brighter Futures 3.0, to develop a credentialing program for retail workers by the League of Innovation in the Community College. The Retail Management Certificate will be offered to incumbent workers at local and regional retail employers for the advancement of their existing workforce.

In order for the District to comply with the Affordable Care Act Regulations, the Division of Human Resources (HR) conducted a comprehensive reconciliation. The HR Team reviewed all employee ACA reportable data in preparation for the distribution of the Federal Form 1095. Employees may use this information/form to report the insurance coverage and status when filing their 2016 tax returns.



DISTRICT ENGAGEMENT WORKSHOPS FOR NEWER EMPLOYEES


