
















District Police Authority

1098T Processing

The General Accounting Department is preparing for its 1098T processing. Tuition payment statements (1098Ts) is the information return that colleges and universities are required to issue for the purpose of determining a student's eligibility for education tax credits. The Bursar's office will be mailing 1098T forms to eligible students by January 31, 2017.

Bursar calculates qualified tuition billed for eligible tax year January 1st Bursar mails tuition tax statements (1098T) to eligible students by January 31st

Bursar sends copy of 1098T file to IRS by March 31st



Miscellaneous 1099 Tax Forms

The Division of Administration and Finance is finalizing reporting and reconciliation of vendor payments for the preparation of Miscellaneous 1099 tax forms for the calendar year 2016. The Fiscal Accountability Operations Center (FAOC) and the Procurement Department align to complete the year-end task by reviewing payments and corresponding vendor data including IRS tax identification numbers and tax designation coding in the Banner database. Issuance of Miscellaneous 1099 reporting is due January 31, 2017.

What's Trending in IE: Significance of Location










Reconciling Open Enrollment






Semester Readiness






Youth Mentoring Workshop




