


National American University Community College Leadership Doctoral Cohort Orientation and Class






Division of Institutional Effectiveness What's Trending in IE: Skills Gap


EFFECTIVENESS



Distance Learning – Teaching-Learning Support










DISTRICT IT HELPDESK TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE DASHBOARD - JUNE 2017




Instructional Supplies on Target for Fall 2017 Semester


The Website Committee met with Adrian Phillips and Dr. Tami Anderson to discuss website updates.

Student community college collaborative discussion group met at the Downtown Campus.




Students from the Summer Water Research Program visited the Water Resource Recovery Facility. They were able to see firsthand the process of cleaning the water for community consumption.
