


#### What's Trending in IE? First-Generation Students

The Division of Institutional Effectiveness routinely analyzes the District's student population to build student profiles that help define our students and support the District's efforts in developing strategies to better serve our diverse student needs. The National Center for Education Statistics Defines "First-Generation" students as undergraduate students whose parents never enrolled in postsecondary education. As many as 30-47% of students entering postsecondary institutions students are first generation students.



Below is the student profile of first generation students at WCCCD. **35%** of students at WCCCD are first-generation students.


# Office of Accountability and Transparency

#### **Motorcycle Certification Course**

The Michigan Institute for Public Safety Education (MIPSE) hosted the Wayne County Sheriff's Motorcycle Certification Course. This course certifies deputies as certified motorcycle operators and the course is Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Services approved.







#### Elite Technical Rescue Technical Rescue Training

MIPSE hosted Elite Technical Rescue for Technical Rescue Training. This training consists of various aspects of saving life or property that employs the use of tools and skills which include rope rescue, confined space rescue, patient packaging, air monitoring, fall protection, and respiratory protection.

They refreshed their training in fire extinguishers, foam application and fire extinguishing including the burn room and shipboard simulator. 
