




District Police Authority


In 2016, two of our students, Ahmed Shakib and Mukthair Shetora, both from Bangladesh, joined the program, and they are now American citizens.



The campuses are working with faculty, staff, students and advisory members to assess needs and develop strategic initiatives and budget for fiscal year 2018.









- 4. Providing resources to answer frequently asked questions
- 5. Learning the protocol for call transfers
- 6. Ensuring each caller has a positive experience

This week, the Eastern Campus hosted a community luncheon celebrating WCCCD's 50 years of service.














Counting Down! Study Abroad trip to Munich, Germany
