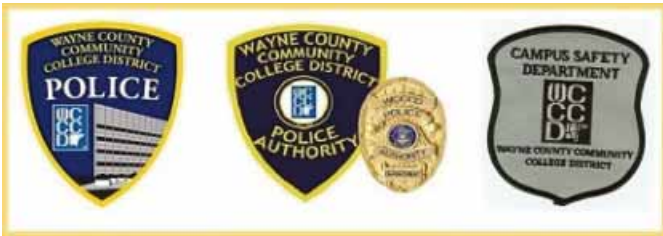

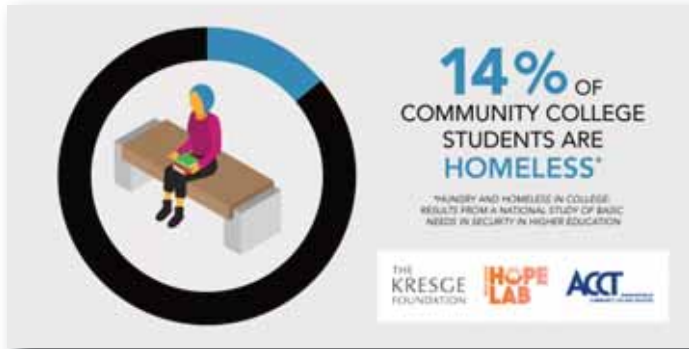
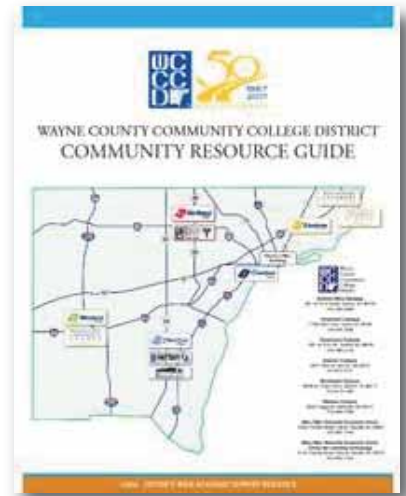

What's Trending in IE: Students' Financial Health

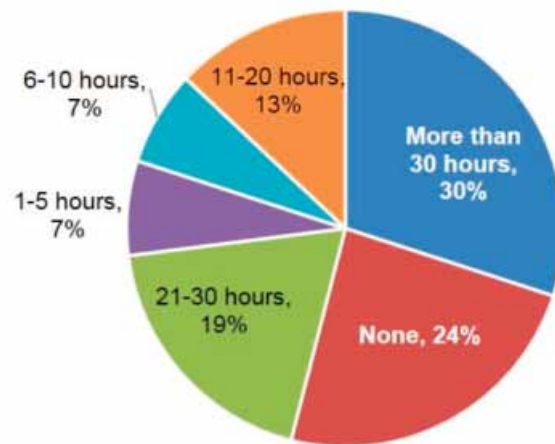

33% of female students are more likely to have children living with them

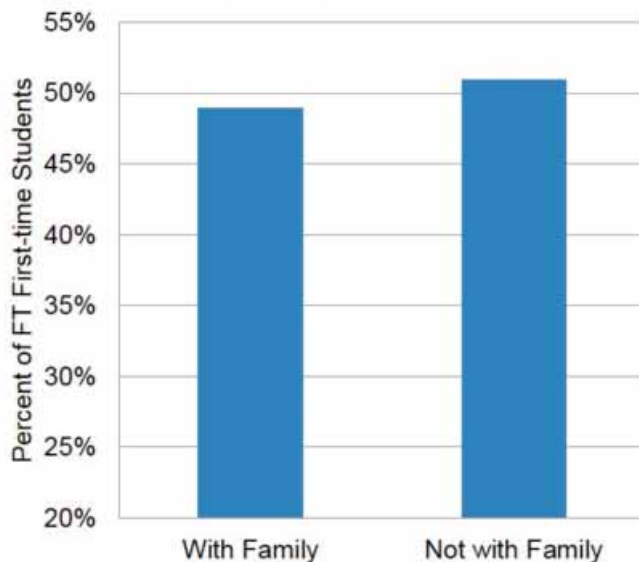
About half of students work more than 20 hours per week

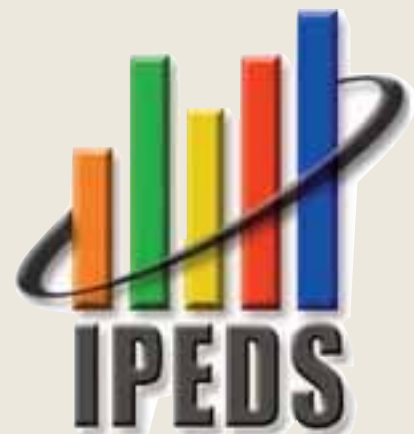
Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System

Team members within the Division of Administration and Finance have begun preparing financial data required for the IPEDS report which is due April 6, 2017.

IPEDS is the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System. It is a system of interrelated surveys conducted annually by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics.



IPEDS gathers information from every college, university, and technical and vocational institution that participates in the federal student financial aid programs. The Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, requires that institutions that participate in federal student aid programs report data on enrollments, program completions, graduation rates, faculty and staff, finances, institutional prices, and student financial aid. More than 7,500 institutions complete IPEDS surveys each year.

The Federal Work Study students have been actively engaged in professional development and have attended various workshops which encourage student's professionalism.

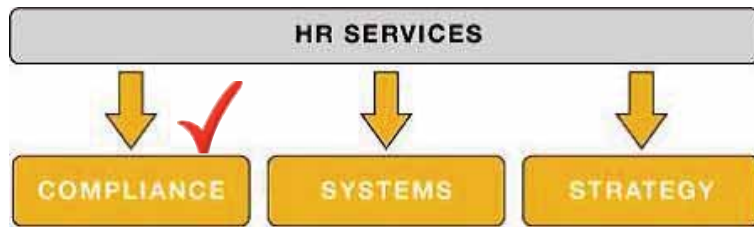


In the Mail...

The Nursing Program conducted the HESI (Health Education Systems, Inc.) exam. This exam is an assessment of one's academic preparedness for college-level educational programs.



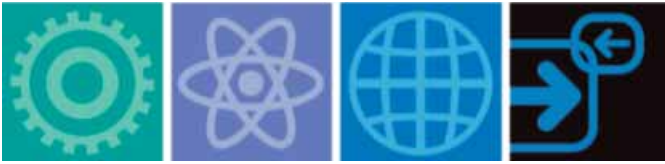
Math Preparation

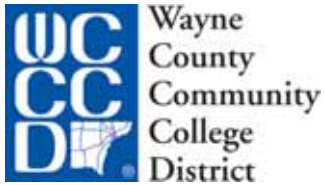
