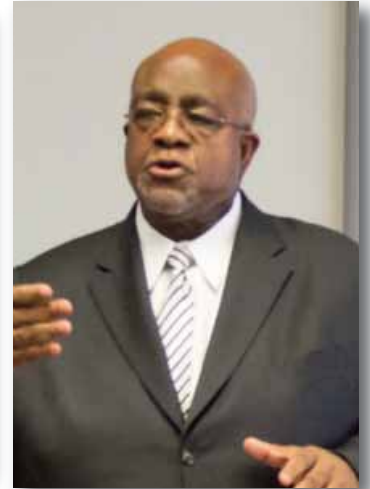
Partnership Opportunity with the American Legion

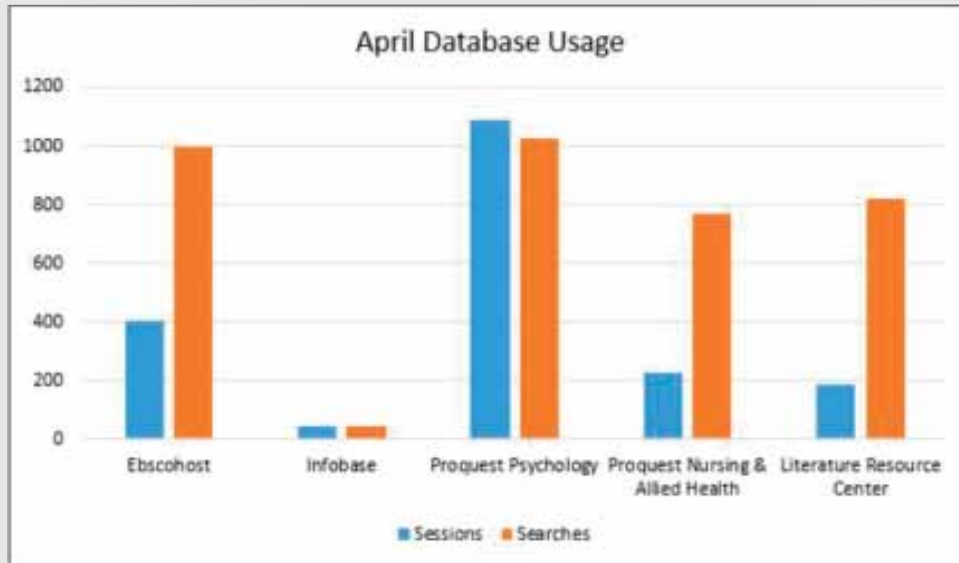

Distance Learning

Distance Learning is now accepting course shell requests in Blackboard. We have received more than 30 requests for Summer 2017. Course shells are used for web-enhanced courses, which are face-to-face classes but with a supplemental information outlet in Blackboard. Faculty are able to post lectures, grades, announcements and any other information students may want to refer to outside of the face-to-face class. Faculty must be web-enhanced certified to request course shells.

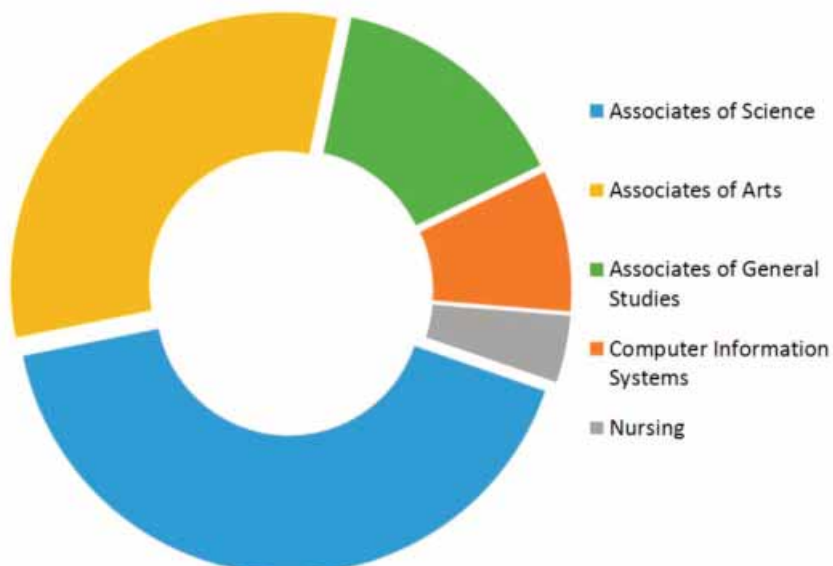

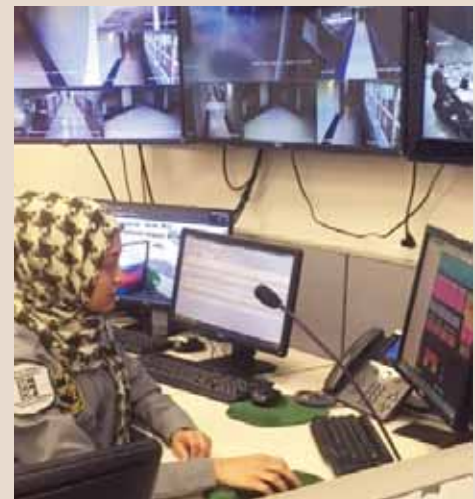
NOBLE Conference

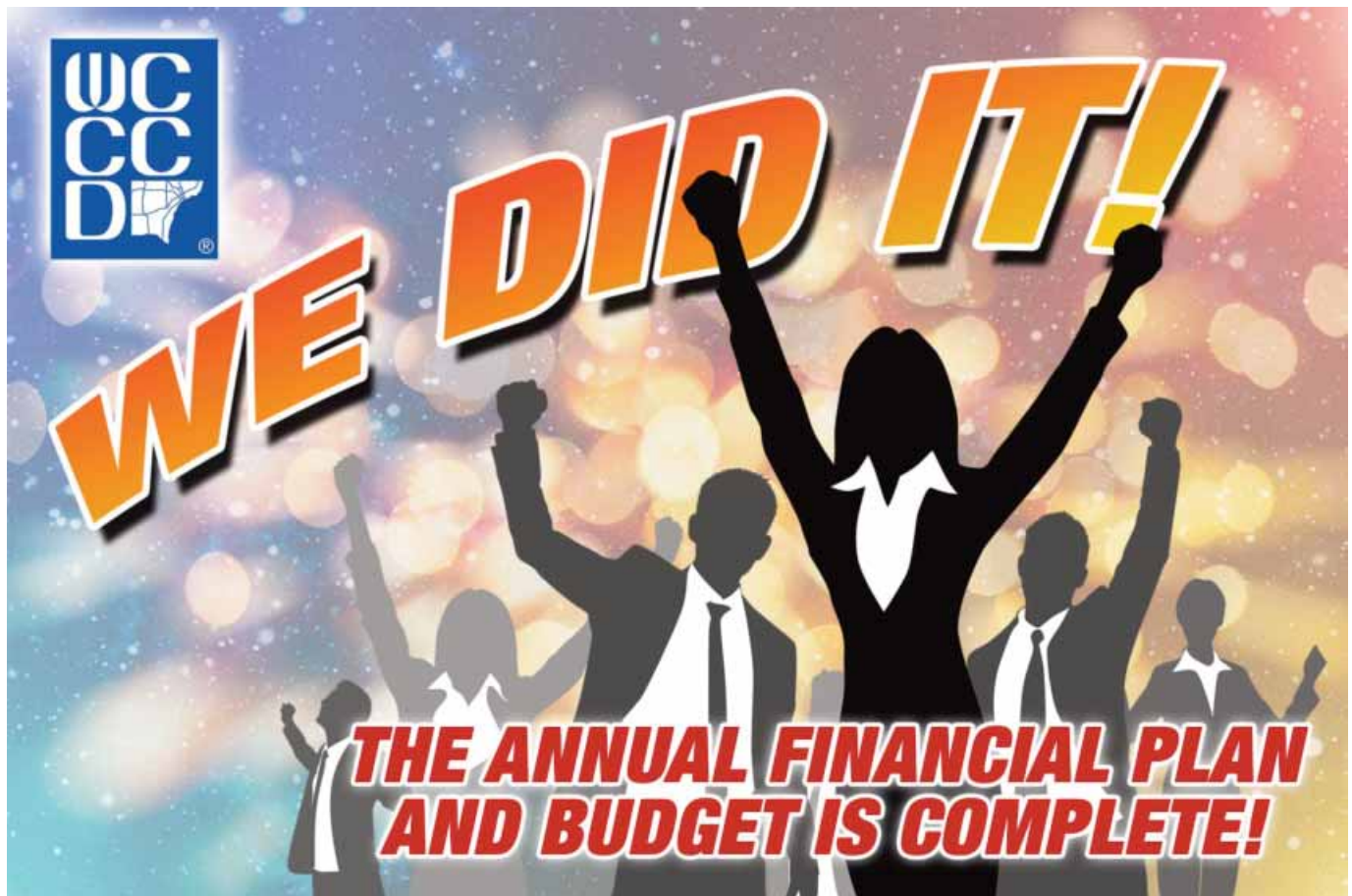
Chancellor's Leadership Institute

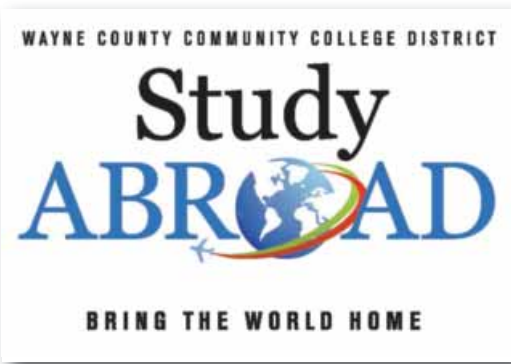


Web Gate Compliance

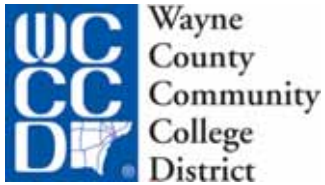
