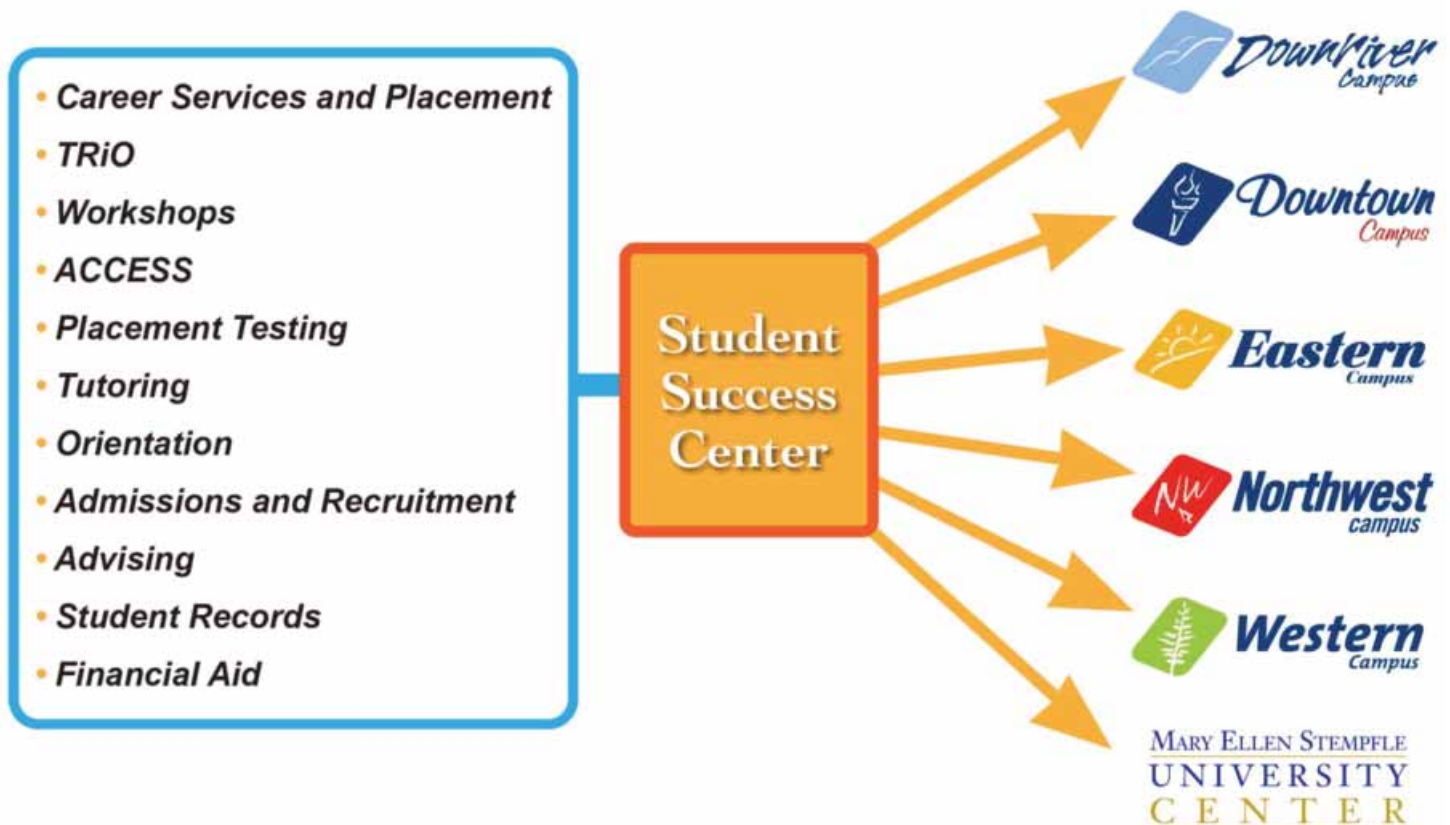

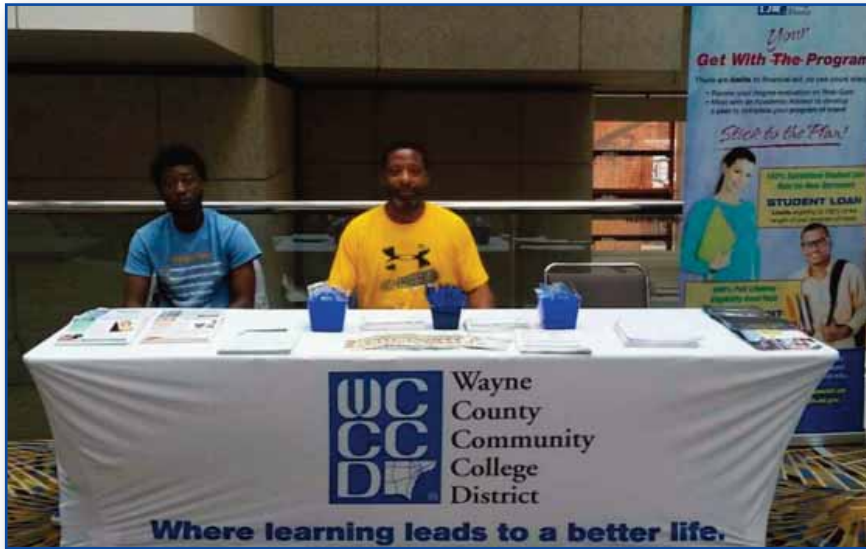

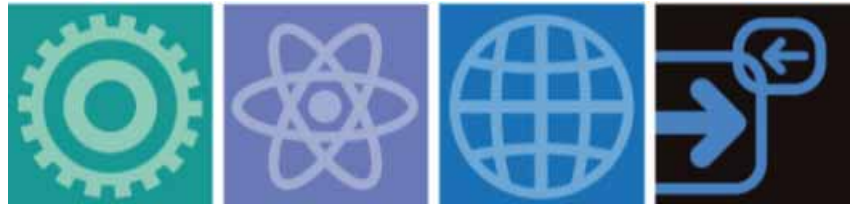

The Division of Human Resources understands that its faculty and staff are the most valuable resources, therefore we continue to meet to devise pathways to recognize their hard work.

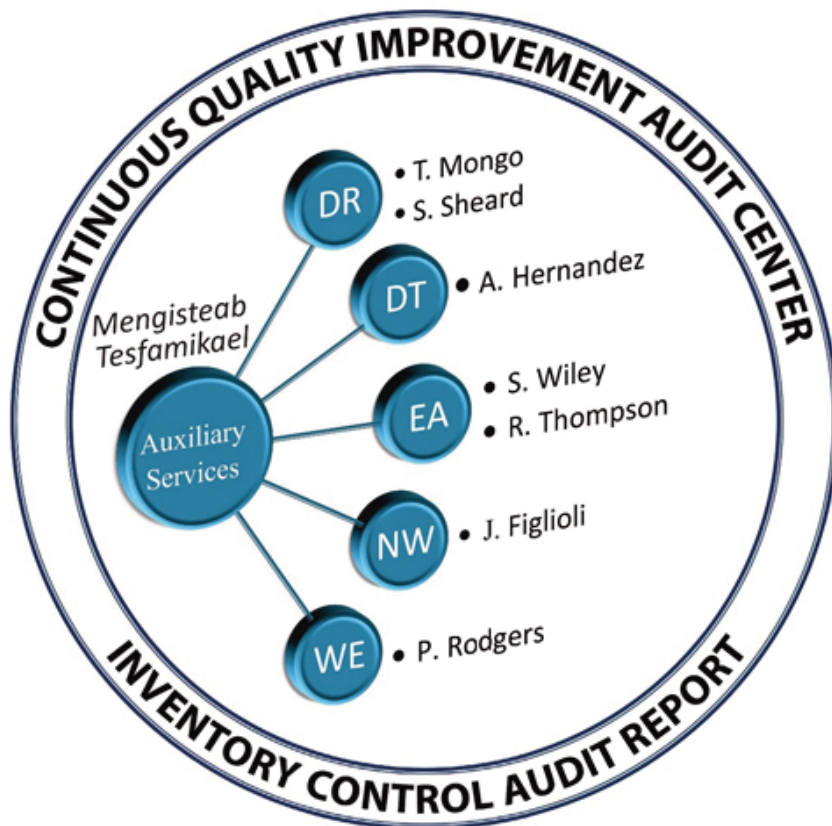
Office of Accountability and Transparency



Inventory Control

The Office of Accountability and Transparency, in conjunction with our Continuous Quality Improvement Initiative, the Chancellor's Office and the Division of Administration and Finance have developed an ongoing process for inventory control. In order to maintain compliance and ensure all inventory is monitored, the District will be collecting bi-weekly reports from each campus location. The following will increase:

- Annual baseline inventory
- Reconciliation of campus inventory
- Data collection for HLC review
- Operational efficiency District-wide
- Compliance standards



1. Finance/Auxiliary Services provides Inventory Control Audit Report (ICAR) baseline with campus presidents.

2. Bi-weekly, campus president will submit the Inventory Control Audit Report to their assigned Executive Project Manager.

3. The Executive Project Manager's will log receipt of the ICAR and submit to Auxiliary Services.

4. The Continuous Quality Improvement Audit Center will also collect the ICAR for data retention and ongoing audit reviews.

2016-17 Fiscal Year-End Close

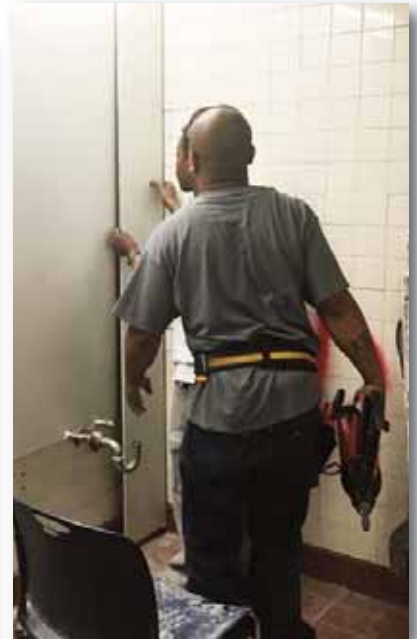

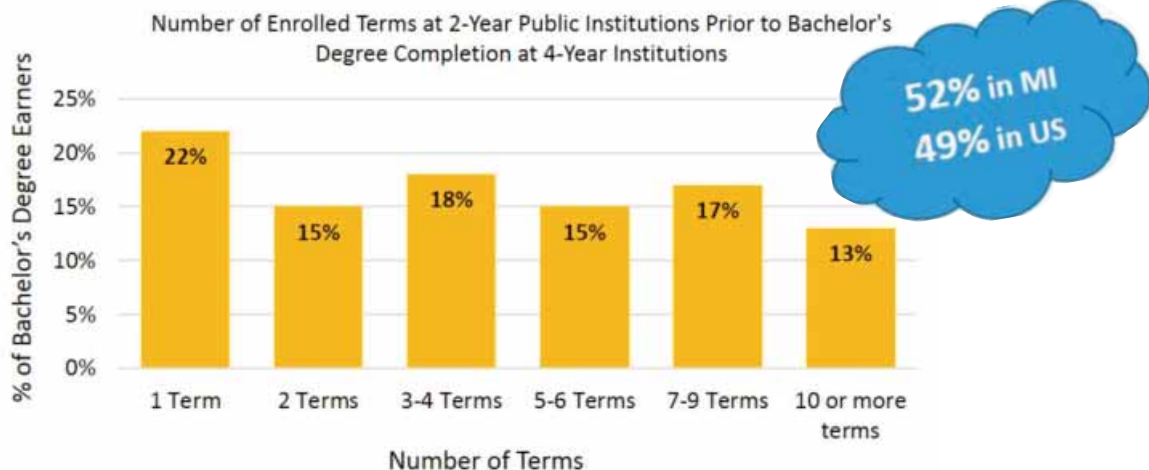


Distance Learning

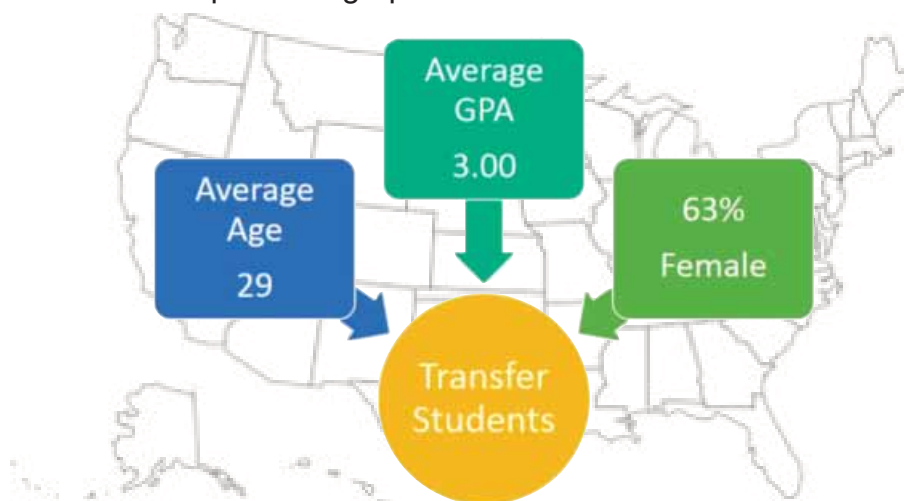

What's Trending in IE: The Role of Two-Year Institutions in Bachelor's Degree Attainment

The Division of Institutional Effectiveness reviews national research to support the District. According to the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center, 49% of all 2015-16 bachelor's degree earners at four-year institutions had been enrolled at a two-year institution at some point in the previous 10 years. Almost two-thirds of these students (63%) were enrolled in two-year public institutions for three or more terms. Below you will find some sample data from this report:

Legislative Corner

Hearing on Data Bills

The House Workforce and Talent Development Committee unanimously voted to support House Bills 4545 and 4546. Together the house bills would clarify that community colleges may access wage data for certain research purposes, and would require the Unemployment Agency to develop a process that entities such as colleges and universities could use to request such data. The bills now go to the full House of Representatives.

Campus Speech Bills to Get Hearing

The Senate Judiciary Committee will take up three bills that would be potentially problematic for community colleges in Michigan. Senate Bill 349 would create the Campus Free Speech Act, creating strict limitations on speech-related policies at public colleges and universities. Senate Bill 350 would require any community college accepting state funds to submit to a number of policies regarding free expression, as well as a Higher Education Committee on Free Expression in the Department of Education.

Federal Budget

Congress finally wrapped up the FY 2017 appropriations process last week. In a major victory for community colleges and their students, Congress reinstated the year-round Pell Grants beginning with the 2017-18 award year as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2017 (H.R. 244). The FY 2017 omnibus bill funds federal agencies and programs through September 30, with most programs of importance to higher education level-funded.

Perkins Reauthorization Introduced

Recently, members of the House Committee on Education and the Workforce introduced the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act, bipartisan legislation to strengthen and improve career and technical education (CTE).

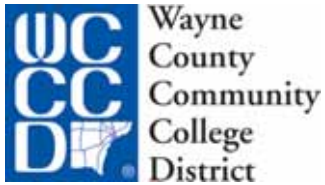
