








**TRiO** students explored their educational and career opportunities as they visited the campus of Eastern Michigan University. They have more than 200 majors and programs to choose from.




This week the Student Success Center dispersed its resources to all six locations to assist with walkin registration to ensure students were able to be advised and get registered.



## Webinar on IRS Form 1098-T




