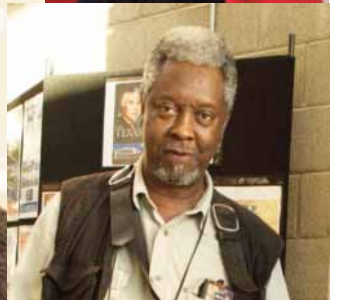

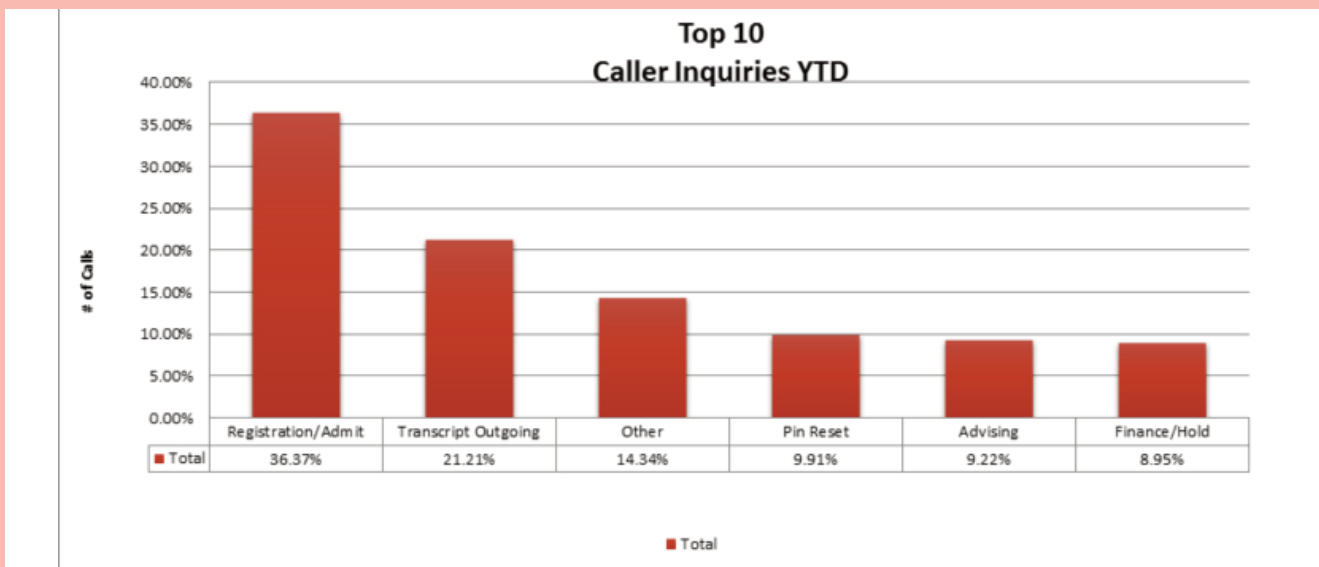

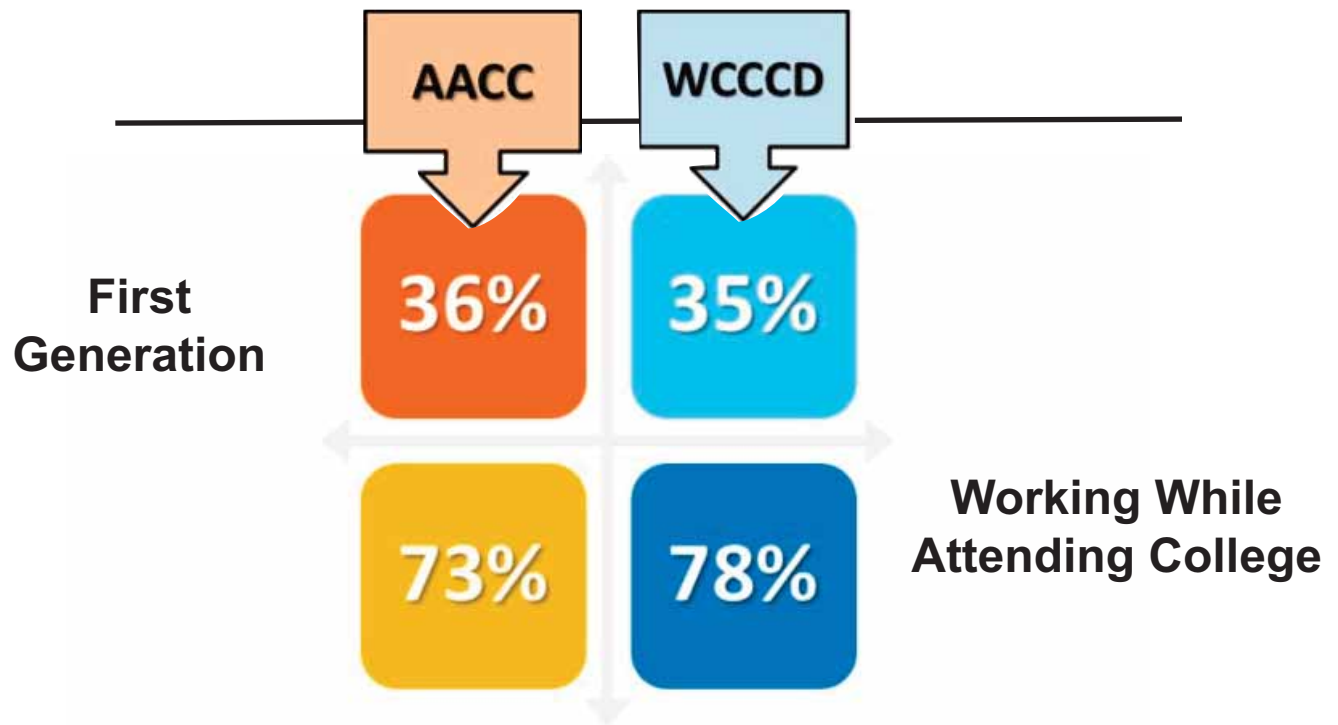

What's Trending in IE: Community College Student Demographics

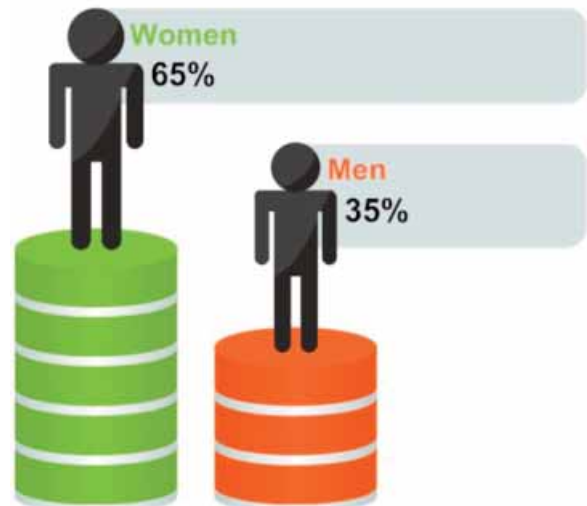

National Gender of Community College Students:



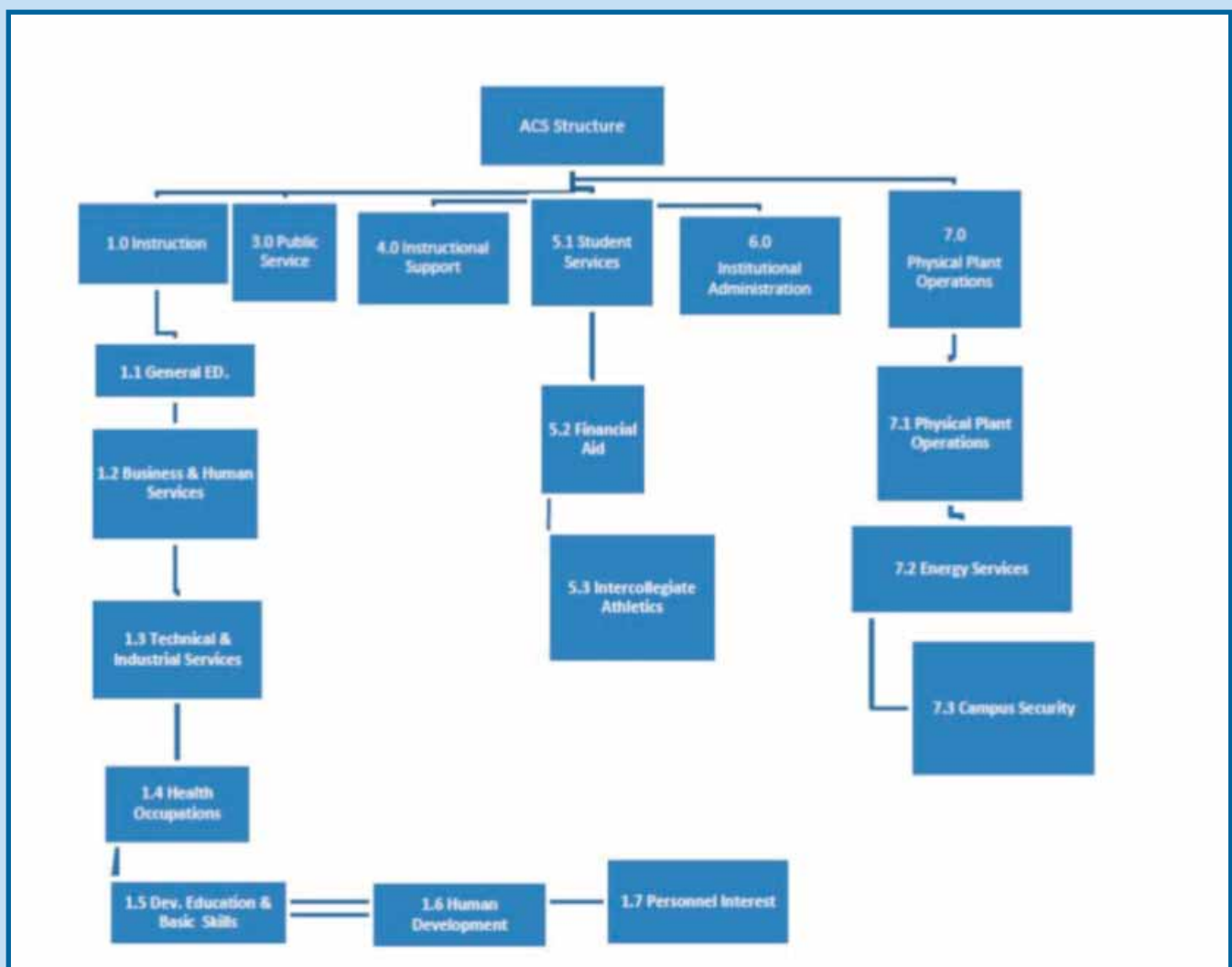
WCCCD Enrollment by Gender

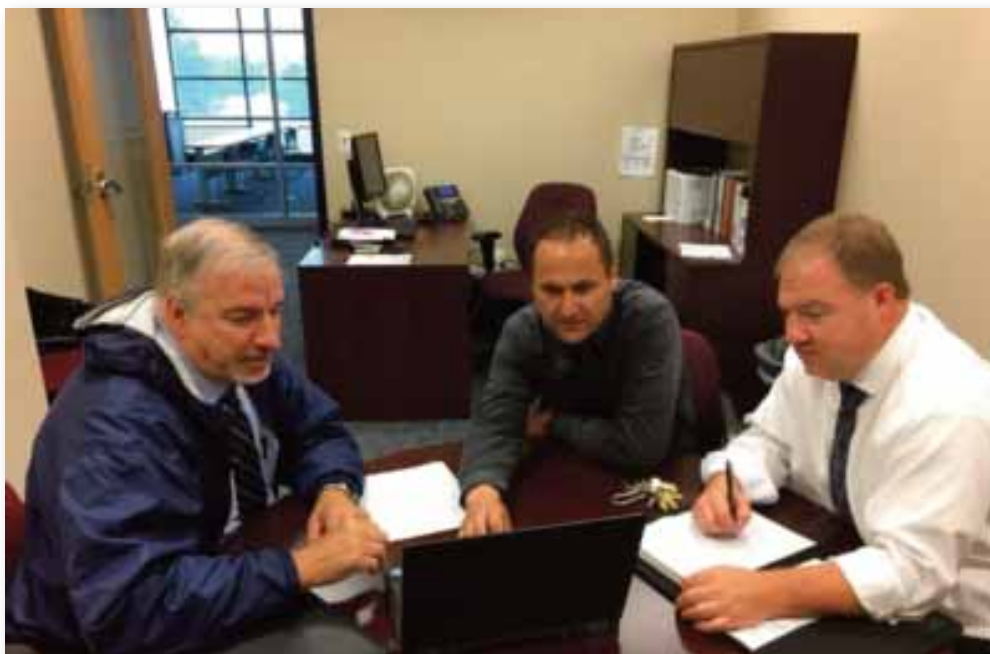
Audit of Employee Certifications

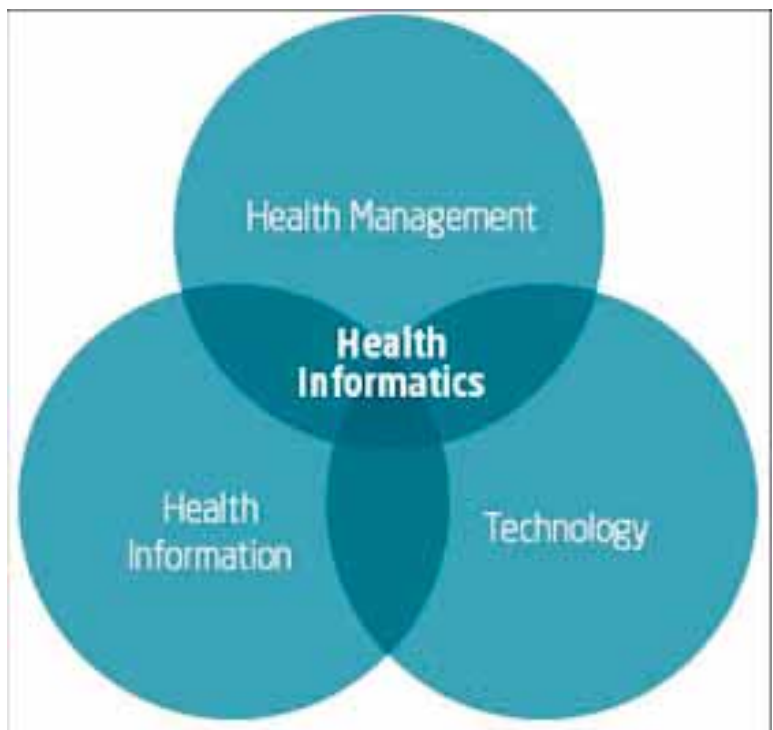
STEM Emersion 101

The Information Technology Institute has developed a STEM Emersion 101 continuing education class for high school students and others interested in health informatics. The course uses the systems development lifecycle and health informatics principles as framework to help students understand the relationship between STEM, informatics, and domains of wellness.

What is Health Informatics?

Health informatics is a term describing the acquiring, storing, retrieving and using of healthcare information to foster better collaboration among a patient's various healthcare providers. Health informatics plays a critical role in the push towards healthcare reform.

Health informatics is an evolving specialization that links information technology, communications and healthcare to improve the quality and safety of patient care.

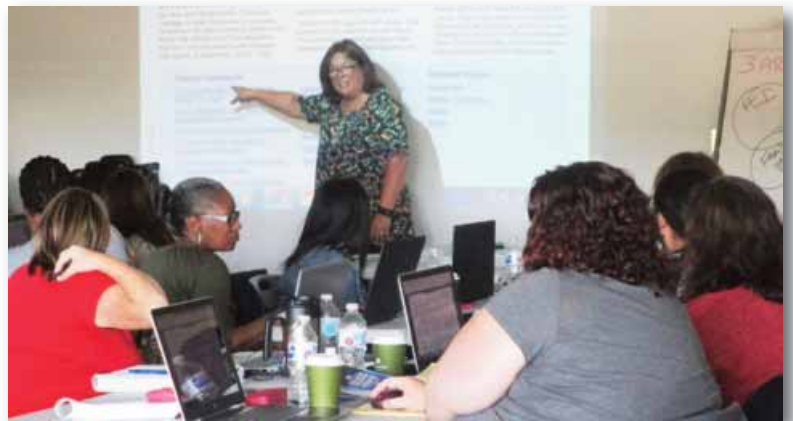


Congresswoman Debbie Dingell Military Academy

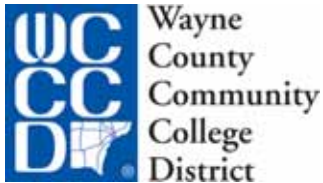
