




Michigan compares favorably to the national job growth rate. The employment numbers have already shown signs of growth experiencing a 12% increase in the number of paralegals and legal assistants employed in Michigan as reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics from May 2011 to May 2014.




















Next stop... Copenhagen, Denmark!














Critical Conversations Podcast
