




The Student Success Center focused on calling each student not attending their classes, encouraging them to contact their instructor and stressing the importance of higher education.


Learning Resource Center (LRC)

Distance Learning

The Retention Center is a tool within Blackboard where faculty can monitor at-risk students. There are four categories to track students: missed deadlines, grades, course activity, and course access. Rules within each category can be set by instructors to check which students are in the top five percent and reward those, while adjusting the rules to remedy problems for other students not performing well.



What's Trending in IE?

According to The American Educational Research Association (AERA) for both men and women, associate degrees and long-term certificates were shown to increase the likelihood of employment and hours worked. Among these findings:


Earning a long-term certificate was associated with a 9% increase in the likelihood of being employed for women and an 11% increase for men.

Earning an associate degree was associated with an 11% increase in the likelihood of being employed for women and an 8% increase for men.

Happening Now: VIOP Project Update

The Division of Information Technology (IT) is preparing for the rollout of VistaPoint call management system for campuses and administrative departments.

VistaPoint provides:

- Complete Call Routing, Queuing and Reporting system for our Cisco Call Manager VoIP system.
- Computer based software that routes calls to longest idle agent.
- A queue for peak call periods and integrates with Cisco Call Manager, call handlers for messaging and has integrated reporting.



We have surveyed the prospective users for each department and we're currently preparing a requisition for hardware for users of the new system.
