



The Language Institute hosted this month's Coffee Hour entitled "Exploring Scola." Faculty members were introduced to the various resources that Scola has to offer.










Employee Records and Credential Review








Staff met to discuss a new initiative to ensure day-to-day operations are managed more effectively in a timely manner. The Priorities Meeting Initiative will occur weekly.







MPSERS Legislative Update

Public Act (PA) 92 of 2017 was signed into law on July 13. Some of the highlights of the plan are summarized below:

Option to Purchase Service Credit Ending September 29, 2017

Active employees who were first hired before 7/1/10 will not be eligible for service credit purchase after 5pm EDT on 9/29/17. For members still interested in purchasing service credit a full payment for the amount of service they wish to buy or a fully completed TDP agreement must be received by the designated deadline date.

Enhanced contribution rates for employees part of the DC Plan

- ♣ Employers will begin mandatory contributions of 4% For DC participants hired since September 4, 2012 and all future DC participants.
- Employers will also match 100% of the contributions made by the employee up to a maximum of 3% beginning 02/1/18.


