




The Instructional team met to prepare for the upcoming annual Advisory Breakfast, Job Fair and Skills Expo.





As part of the VDI upgrade project, the team participated in a WebEx session with Dell to discuss hardware, software, and license options.







Division of Institutional Effectiveness





Always be suspicious of emails, even if they appear to come from a trusted source. When in doubt, call the sender and ask if they sent the email.
