




The Student Service Team welcomed Marty Bulger into his new role as principal of River Rouge High School.

The Downriver Campus presented a Lincoln Park High School tour and information session. Students were provided information regarding admissions, registration, programs, short term certificates, and financial aid options.








#### **Advising and Orientation**
