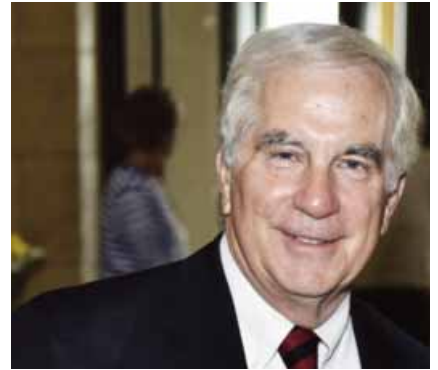


Mary Ellen Stempfle University Center Senior Fun Day
