

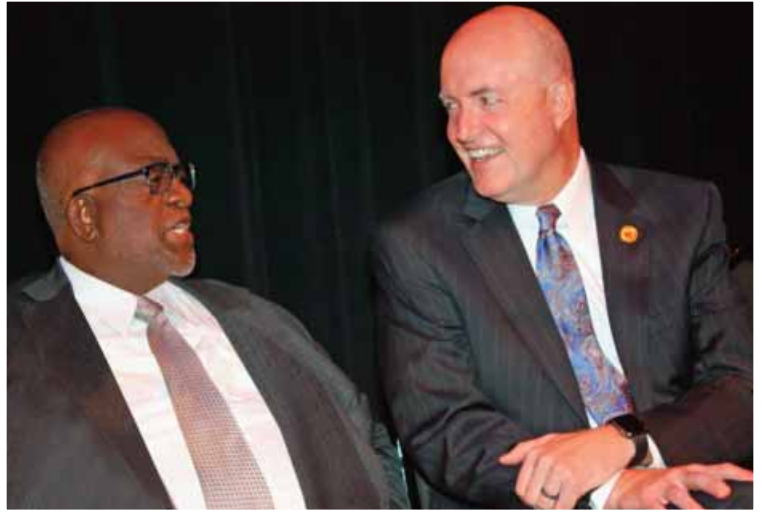

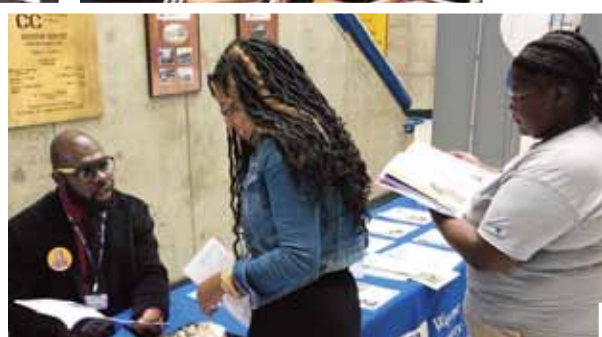

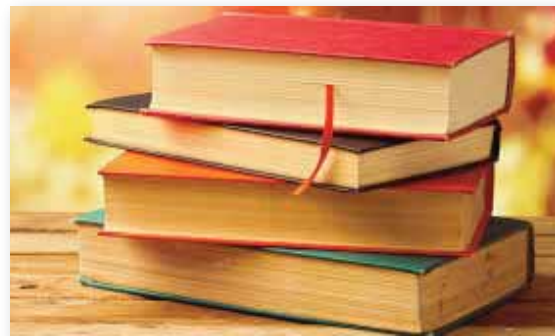
### Academic Career and Transfer Programs

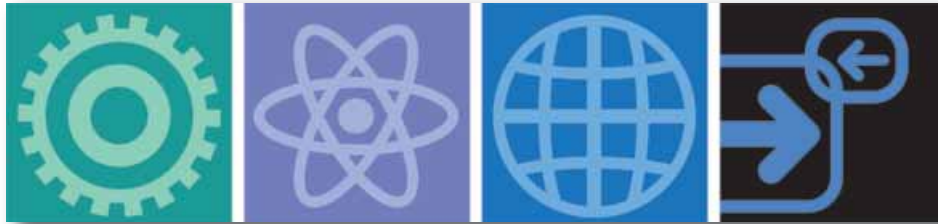

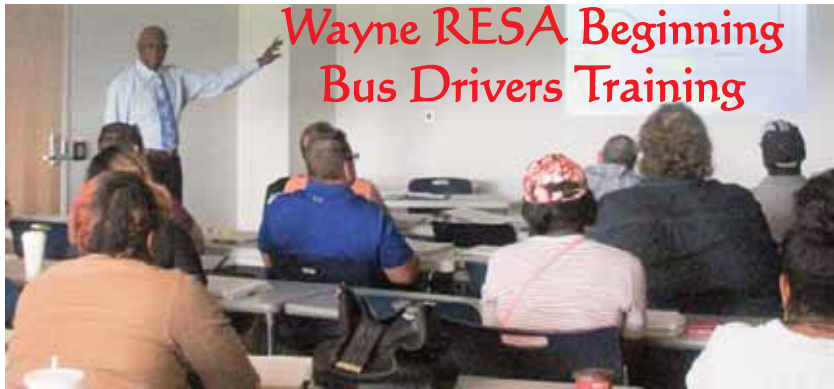
## The School of Continuing Education and Workforce Development Social Media Certificate Cohort I Completion

The Buddies in Business Summer Youth Employment Program is a program for youth to be exposed to educational opportunities.



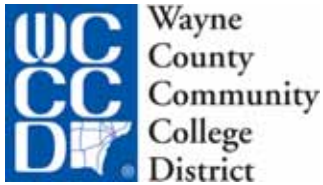
