




Water Research Presentation




Learning Resources Center Collections



Northwestern's Medical First Responder's class discussed child birth in a pre-hospital setting. Students had the opportunity to deliver a mock baby during this class.



The Mary Ellen Stempfle University Center hosted Blackwood Financial Services for a Financial Literacy Workshop.




League of Women Voters
