






#### **Recruitment and Outreach**


The District Student Success Center specialists reached out to priority registration students reminding them to register for Fall 2018.

Participants were provided a definition of a rubric and discussed the various types. They also identified components of and steps to developing a rubric.







## What's Trending in IE: Part-time students




