




















Outreach and Recruitment

Division of Institutional Effectiveness






Dr. Patrick McNally met with the Instructional Leadership Team.




Learning Resource Centers

Freshwater Future



End-User Telephone training is coming to the District Office!


The Division, in collaboration with the Division of Human Resources, will hold multiple VoIP phone refresher sessions. The sessions will cover basic phone features and operations such as:
