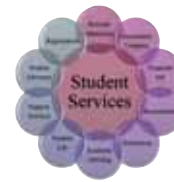
WCCCD participated in Hamtramck High School's Decisions Day. Students were provided the opportunity to make a formal commitment to attend WCCCD.

Dual Enrollment



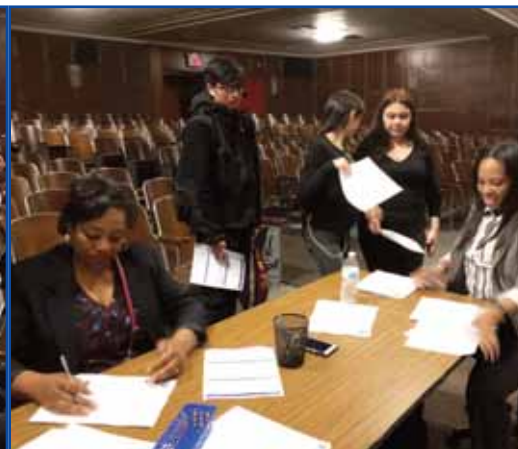

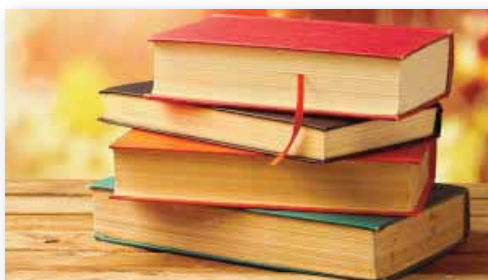
The District Recruitment Team visited Western International High School to meet with the senior class. They received information on career programs and completed admissions applications in preparation for Summer and Fall 2018.
